Additionally, St. John's provides tertiary care to residents of Bond, Brown, Clay, Coles, De Witt, Effingham, Fayette, Greene, Marion, Mason, Moultrie, Piatt, Pike, Schuyler and Shelby counties. Aside from the city of Springfield, the economy of St. John's service area is primarily rural and is supported by small businesses, industries, mining and agriculture. Springfield, on the other hand, is an urban area supported by large businesses, such as the Illinois State Government and other industries. Based on 2017 population estimates derived from the 2010 census, Sangamon County's population of 196,452 people is comprised of 82.4 percent Caucasians, 12.9 percent African Americans, 0.5 percent American Indians/Alaska Natives, 2.0 percent Asians and 2.3 percent Hispanic or Latino. Ninety two percent of Sangamon County's residents over 25 have a high school diploma or higher. The current (as of July 20181) unemployment rate of Sangamon County is 4.1 percent, according to the US Bureau of Labor Statistics, and the median household income is \$56,742. St. John's secondary service area is comprised of 228,373 people, of whom 88.72 percent are Caucasian, 7.38 percent are African-American, 0.22 percent are American Indian/Alaska Native, 1.08 percent are Asian, 0.02 percent are Native Hawaiian/Other Pacific Islander, 0.85 percent state another race and 1.75 percent state two or more races. Educational levels of this population reflect that 35.44 percent graduated high school, 8.17 percent graduated with an associate's degree, 14.84 percent graduated with a bachelor's degree, 5.76 percent graduated with a master's degree and 2.42 percent graduated with either a professional school degree or a doctorate degree. The average unemployment rate of the combined counties is 6.74 percent and the median household income is \$47,525. Within St. John's Hospital's service area 17.12 percent of the population is living below the Federal Poverty Level (FPL). This is higher than the statewide poverty level of 15 percent. This indicator is relevant because poverty creates barriers to access including health services, nutritional food and other necessities that contribute to poor health status. St. John's Hospital, employs more than 2,300 people, is a regional medical center and the flagship hospital of Hospital Sisters Health System. In tandem with a variety of cross sector community partners, HSHS's Community Benefit initiatives are strategically planned and professionally implemented to improve access to health care services; enhance the health of the community; advance medical or

general health care knowledge; and relieve or reduce the burden of government to improve health. In FY2019, HSHS collectively provided \$211.7 million in Community Benefit (9.2% of total hospital expenses). This amount included \$27.7 million provided for Financial Assistance (a.k.a. Charity Care) and \$142.3 million for unreimbursed care provided as part of the Medicaid program. In addition, HSHS hospitals committed significant resources to treat Medicare patients. The cost of providing services to

primarily elderly beneficiaries of the Medicare program - in excess of governmental and managed care contract payments - was \$279.9 million. HSHS hospitals also recorded \$41.1 million in uncollectible accounts. While HSHS does not count the latter two amounts as Community Benefit, they nonetheless

reflect our commitment to serving all persons in need of care. In response to Facility , 1 the FY2015 CHNA, the hospital planned, implemented and evalua ted strategies to address the top four identified community health needs: pediatric asthma, mental health, childhood obesity and access to care. The FY2018 assessment built on that collaboration, actively seeking input from a cross section of community stakeholders with the goal of reaching consensus on priorities to mutually focus human, material and financ ial resources. The external advisory committee was used as the primary stakeholder group to review and force rank data. During three meetings, community stakeholders were asked to review data presented and provide additional sources for priority areas not listed. The ex ternal advisory committee also helped develop the community survey tool and outcomes and r ecommendations on the final priorities. The external advisory committee also helped identify community assets and gaps which were weighed when considering the magnitude and feasibi lity of the priority areas. Lastly, their feedback was instrumental in developing the impl ementation plan. The University of Illinois Office of Survey Research (UIS SRO) circulated an electronic survey on behalf of the core group in January 2018. In total 1,079 individu als completed the survey. UIS SRO analyzed and provided the results to the external and in ternal advisory teams. The results were used to guide further discussion around final prio rity selection. Focus groups were conducted around the final priority areas selected and helped determine the implementation plan adopted by the board of directors. More information about the focus groups can be found in the implementation plan document HSHS and St. Joh n's Hospital are committed to promoting and defending human dignity, caring for persons li ving in poverty and other vulnerable persons, promoting the common good and stewarding res ources. We believe the CHNA process must be informed by input from the poor and vulnerable populations we seek to serve. Goals: 1. To develop community-wide strategies to address accidental suffocat ion and strangulation of infants. 2. To utilize a home-visiting nurse to assist first-time moms and NICU infants and families to identify resources and provide timely care for heal thier infants and moms. Strategy 1: Explore the issue of infant mortality, particularly ac cidental asphyxiation In Sangamon County, there were a total of 27 infant deaths

reported in the first year of life. These deaths occurred in the home. Eighteen deaths were attributed to accidental asphyxiation. While the number of infants impacted does not represent a large percentage of total babies born, we feel there is education that can occur to better equip parents and guardians on infant safety post discharge. The hospital has identified and surveyed 25 organizations who provide education on safe sleep. We have also been working with the Sangamon County Coroner to collect recent data for the number of sleep related infant deaths. Three meetings were held with stakeholders to conduct an asset and gaps as sessment and identify opportunities for improved messaging and delivery of messaging. In F Y2020, we have scheduled focus groups with community members and providers to discuss safe sleep perceptions, messaging, and challenges. Recommendations for a campaign will be made in December 2019 and then reviewed by the hospital's Legal and Risk departments for approval. approach patients through a trauma informed lens. In FY2019, 150 students we're educated, and 200 students were recently educated in September 2019 (FY2020). Needs Not Being Addressed: As an outcome of the prioritization process, the following community health needs were also identified and will not be addressed directly by the hospital for the reasons indicated: Asthma: The local county health department is the lead on asthma educat ion and the treatment of affected community members. Additionally, a community roundtable has convened to address the need to identify and mitigate asthma triggers in inner-city and older homes. Education: The external and internal advisory committee members felt educat ion could be wrapped into each of the final priority areas to raise awareness, educate and see positive change occur. Therefore, education was not selected as a standalone priority



The Emergency Room is a Level 1 Trauma Center that services Central Illinois. The total visit volume is approximately 55,000 with a 17% admission rate. The Connect Program is a regional referral program that started in 2010. The program is a one-call system that focuses on physician alignment and clinical protocols. St. John's has a dedicated outreach representative that works with referring hospitals to address any issues and to improve the services. St. John's has three hospitalist groups servicing the patients: HSHS Medical Group (which has grown significantly over the past 5 - 6 years), Springfield Clinic, and Southern Illinois University (SIU). This program enables the hospitalist to manage the in-hospital care for patients and coordinates care with other consulting MD's, if needed. An effective hospitalist program can benefit hospitals by reducing length of stay, improving hospital efficiencies, and improving quality care. This program also enables primary care MD's to reduce time at the hospital and spend more time at their practice. HSHS Medical Group Hospitalists managed the highest percentage of Internal Medicine Inpatients in FY19 with 46% of Internal Medicine Cases.

The next largest was Springfield Clinic physicians with Internal Medicine specialty at 10% and SIU Hospitalist at 9%.
