During the period a total of \$90506.96 was paid out to nine students enrolled in various colleges and technical schools and a total of \$8723.94 was paid out for administrative expenses

No officer or member of the governing board receives any reimbursement

No recipient of scholarship funds is a child, grandchild or sibling of any officer or member of the governing board, or to the donor who established the trust fund nor any person connected to the Alice and Noah Langdale Foundation.

**REGULATIONS
GOVERNING GRANTING OF SCHOLARSHIPS
A.T. BRIGHTWELL SCHOOL, INC.**

I. GENERAL INFORMATION:

- (a) The A.T. Brightwell School, Inc. does not discriminate on the basis of Race, Color, Creed, or National Origin.
- (b) The Board of Directors may determine the number of Board members. Parents, grandparents, siblings, and/or court appointed legal guardians of students receiving scholarships will not serve as Board members.
- (c) The following "Regulations Governing Granting of Scholarships by the A.T. Brightwell School, Inc." supersedes the original Regulations dated Sept. 19, 1960 and all subsequent amendments to date.

II. RESIDENTIAL REQUIREMENTS:

- (a) Any person making application for a scholarship, and his/her parent or parents or permanent legal guardian by court order must be citizens of the United States, and must have actually lived in the Maxeys area, as described herein, for no less than two (2) years immediately prior to the effective date of the scholarship and before the person graduates from high school or otherwise becomes first eligible for admission to college, technical school or any other educational program for which a scholarship is available. The parent or parents or permanent legal guardian shall remain residents of the described Maxeys area, or maintain such residence for the length of time as such person receiving the scholarship may remain a recipient of the scholarship. By maintaining a residence, it is meant that this shall be the principal place of residence, except for temporary absences due to health, business, or being called to active military duty, and a home shall be maintained throughout the length of time the scholarship remains in effect.
- (b) If said parent or parents or permanent legal guardian change residence from the described Maxeys area, then the scholarship will remain in effect only until the quarter/semester/or equivalent (depending upon the arrangement of the school attended) is ended in which the student is then enrolled.
- (c) During the time the scholarship is in effect, the student may live in the area where the school is located that he/she is attending.
- (d) Boundaries of the Maxeys area for this purpose shall be a one (1) mile radius from the marker located at the site of the old home of A.T. Brightwell in Maxeys, Georgia. Recipients of the scholarship shall reside on land within this one mile radius. The house may be within one and one quarter (1) mile of the described marker, provided the property on which the dwelling is situated continues unbroken into the one mile radius.

III. PERSONAL REQUIREMENTS:

- (a) An applicant must meet above residential requirements, be a High School graduate, or hold a GED (General Equivalency Diploma) be approved for scholarship, and enter College, Technical, or Business School before age 21.
- (b) A person convicted of a felony, or who has pled guilty to a felony, is ineligible to receive a scholarship. The person may apply for a scholarship if rights have been restored.
- (c) A student must maintain a passing grade satisfactory to remain in school. If a student is dropped from school for academic reasons, or poor conduct, the scholarship is cancelled.
- (d) If a student drops out of school for any reason other than personal illness, or being called to active military duty, the scholarship is cancelled.
- (e) Students are required to sign a form each quarter/semester certifying that all the money received as scholarship was used for educational purposes.

IV. SCHOLARSHIP GRANTS:

- (a) The scholarship grant is to be used toward payment of tuition and fees; room and board; books and supplies; and other regular incidentals at the school, college or university of the student's choice, provided it is in the Continental United States.
- (b) The Basic scholarship amount, per student, per quarter/semester, etc, will be at the discretion of the Board of Directors. Factors to be considered include: Amount of income from the Trust, number of students receiving scholarships, average college expenses, etc. The Board may at its discretion award an annual Merit Scholarship based on quality grade points earned during the regular academic year. Attachment (1) provides the computational method to determine the scholarship amount per student.
- (c) The percent of the Basic scholarship amount an individual student may receive each quarter/semester will be determined by the following factors:

COLLEGE - UNIVERSITY - BUSINESS - VOCATIONAL - TECHNICAL.
UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAM – Regular – Quarter or Semester:

1. First Quarter/Semester - number of hours carried.
2. Succeeding Quarters/Semesters - number hrs. passed previous Qtr/Sem.
 - Minimum of 5 hrs. = 1/3 Basic Scholarship
 - Minimum of 8 hrs. = 2/3 Basic Scholarship
 - Minimum of 10 hrs. = Full Basic Scholarship
3. Student will not receive scholarship payment for "Remedial" courses in excess of 15 hours, during his/her scholarship eligibility.
4. Student will not receive scholarship payment for "P.E." courses in excess of 2 hours during his/her scholarship eligibility. (Exception: Physical Education Major.)

SUMMER SESSION: No scholarships available at this time.

GRADUATE PROGRAM: Students may apply to the Board of Directors to utilize any of their remaining undergraduate scholarship eligibility for graduate study commencing no later than the

first fall semester after graduation from their undergraduate program. Application letters must be submitted no later than 15 May for the following fall semester. Prior to acceptance, applicants must provide proof of undergraduate graduation and acceptance by the graduate program. Scholarship approval will be at the Board's discretion.

V. EDUCATIONAL COVERAGE:

- (a) Scholarships shall be granted to eligible persons to any accredited college, university, business, vocational-technical school in the continental United States, provided all above lead to worthwhile employment. Scholarships will be granted in an objective and non-discriminatory manner without regard to race, color, creed or national origin.
- (b) Students seeking the BACHELORS DEGREE may receive scholarship grants for a maximum of 14 Quarters or 9 & 1/3 Semesters.
- (c) Grants to cover educational courses- at VOCATIONAL-TECHNICAL & BUSINESS schools to completion of training, not to exceed 14 quarters or 9 & 1/3 semesters.
- (d) No student may receive more than 14 quarters or 9 & 1/3 semesters of scholarship below the Masters level.
- (e) At the beginning of a student's 9th quarter, or 6th semester on scholarship, the student is required to submit to the Board of Directors a "STATEMENT OF INTENTION" - i.e., degree working toward; expected graduation date; etc. The student must also provide a projected schedule of courses to be taken each remaining quarter/semester until graduation. Schedule must be signed by the students Faculty Advisor.

VI. In the event some situation arises in regard to granting of scholarships which is not covered by the Rules and Regulations, adopted by the Board, then the Board may take such action as they see fit in regard to the question that has arisen.

Attachment 1 Procedures for Computing Merit Scholarship amounts

Procedures for Computing Merit Scholarship Amounts

The following procedures will be utilized when computing end of the FY Merit Scholarship amounts:

1. For each student multiply course hour credits x quality points for grades received. Example: A "B" in a 3 hour credit course = 9 quality points. A=4.0, A-=3.7, B+=3.3, B=3.0, B-=2.7, C+=2.3, C=2.0, C-=1.7, D+=1.3, D=1.0, D-=.70
2. Total the quality points earned per student for the year.
3. If the student is attending a school on the quarter system (generally the Technical Schools,) multiply the total quality points earned by .66 to equalize quarter and semester hours. Example: 82 quarter hours quality points = 53.46 semester hours quality points. Note: The .66 conversion factor is what is used by all schools in both the Georgia and SC University systems when students transfer from a school on the quarter system to a school on semester.
4. If a student is attending a Tech school, multiply his/her earned quality points by .60. We have historically granted Tech school scholarships at 60 % of University amounts. Example: A quarter system tech school student earning 81 quarter hours quality points would have $81 \text{ hours} \times .66 = 53.46$ (to equate to semester hours) and then $53.46 \times .60 = 32.08$ adjusted quality points to earn 60% of a full University scholarship amount.
5. Total the quality points earned, (adjusted down where applicable) for all students.
6. Divide the total amount of money available for merit scholarships by the total number of quality points earned by all students. This answer is the amount of money 1 quality point is worth.
7. If, for example, each quality point is worth \$65.97 (as was the case in 2007,) then multiply $\$65.97 \times \text{number of quality points earned}$, (again using the adjusted down points where applicable,) by a student during the year and that equals the amount of his merit scholarship.
8. Students graduating before the end of the year are eligible to receive merit scholarship for the grades they received while they were eligible for Brightwell scholarships. Grades must be submitted within two weeks of graduation.
9. Students who are still in school but have received all of their eligible scholarships will receive merit scholarship monies based only on the grades received during their eligibility period. Example: Johnny is on the 7 year program and has received all his 9 1/3 semester scholarship payments will not be eligible to receive merit monies for any grades received after his Brightwell eligibility has expired.
