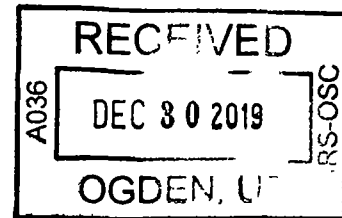

- A discussion of current progress toward the goal, including a budget and listing of contributors.

PLEASE ATTACH

- A copy of the Internal Revenue Service letter stating that the organization is not a private foundation as defined in IRC Section 509(a)(1).
- If your application is accepted for grant you will be furnished with a form of Statement of Donee which must be returned before payment can be made. This Statement will be retained in the Foundation records and may be relied upon for any future grant.

In awarding grants, the Foundation limits its support to local or regional agencies in those communities with concentrations of Donaldson Company, Inc employees. We do not support national drives. We direct our contributions to the major community programs supporting our main focus area of education.

We do not give grants to individuals, to organizations for religious purposes, to groups that exist to influence specific legislation, or to associations that participate or intervene in political campaigns. Applicants must qualify for tax exemption under the Internal Revenue Code and be an organization that is not a private foundation.
