Scholarship Program

1. Scholarship is for a period of four years.

 - b. In case the student must discontinue schooling, for unavoidable reasons, during the four year period, the scholarship may be reinstated, at the discretion of the Puckett Foundation.
2. The scholarship is to be awarded to a graduating senior of the Fairfield Community High School.
3. The scholarship will be awarded on the basis of scholarship, ability, industry and integrity.
4. Application for the scholarship must be made to the High School Guidance Office by March 1.
5. Applicant must meet the following criteria:

6. The selection of the recipient of the scholarship will be made by the faculty of the Fairfield Community High School by April 1.
