

AMENDED AND RESTATED BYLAWS OF

RICHARD AND FRANCINE LOEB FAMILY FOUNDATION

These Amended and Restated Bylaws of the Richard and Francine Loeb Family Foundation, a Washington Nonprofit Corporation, are effective on September 16, 2019, and shall amend, restate and supersede any and all Bylaws previously adopted by the Company.

ARTICLE 1. OFFICES

The principal office and place of business of the corporation in the State of Washington shall be located at 1000 2nd Ave, Fl. 34, Seattle, Washington 98104.

ARTICLE 2. BOARD OF DIRECTORS

- 2.1 <u>General Powers</u>. The business and affairs of the corporation shall be managed by its Board of Directors. In addition to its other powers and authority, the Board shall have the full power, except as prohibited by the terms of any gift, devise, bequest or other transfer, in its sole discretion, to change the form of any investment and, for that or other purposes of the corporation, to dispose of any property held by the corporation. Directors need not be residents of the State of Washington.
- 2.2 Number of Directors. The Board of Directors of this corporation shall consist of not less than one (1) and not more than four (4). Upon execution of these amended and restated Bylaws, the number of directors shall be two (2): Richard Loeb and Francine Loeb. The number of directors may be increased or decreased from time to time by amendment to or in the manner provided in these Bylaws. No decrease, however, shall have the effect of shortening the term of any incumbent director unless such director resigns or is removed in accordance with the provisions of these Bylaws. The corporation shall have no members.
- 2.3 <u>Tenure</u>. Richard Loeb and Francine Loeb shall each hold office until such director dies, becomes incapacitated, or resigns. Any other director shall serve for such term as shall be established by the Board of Directors or until such director resigns or is removed in accordance with these Bylaws.
- 2.4 <u>Death or Incapacity of Directors</u>. When Richard Loeb and Francine Loeb are no longer living, the Richard and Francine Loeb Family Foundation shall be dissolved, and after paying or making adequate provision for payment of all of the liabilities its assets will be distributed as follows:
 - a) If the Loeb Charitable Foundation is still in existence and still qualifies for tax exempt status under Section 50l(c)(3) of the Code, all assets will be distributed to this Foundation.
 - b) If the Loeb Charitable Foundation is not in existence or is no longer tax-exempt, one-half of the assets will be distributed to the Stephen and Dianne Loeb Family Foundation, and the other half will be distributed to the Loeb/Shulman Legacy Foundation or another Foundation headed by Donald K. Loeb. If any Foundation named in this paragraph is no longer in existence or no longer tax-exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code, such share of the assets shall be distributed to Temple de Hirsch Sinai or to another qualified charity or charities as specified in the minutes of the Richard and Francine Loeb Family Foundation.

- c) No director, trustee or officer of the corporation, nor any private individual, shall be entitled to share in the distribution of any of the corporate assets upon dissolution of the corporation or the winding up of its affairs. Upon the failure of any of the above distributions for any reason, such share of the Foundation's assets shall be distributed by the board of directors to a nonprofit fund, foundation, or corporation which is organized and duly operated exclusively for charitable, educational, religious, scientific or literary purposes, and which at that time qualifies for tax exempt status under Section 50l(c)(3) of the Code. Any assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the Superior Court of King County, Washington, for the purposes set forth in Article 3 of these Articles of Incorporation or to such organization or organizations as the Superior Court of King County shall determine to be organized and operated for similar purposes.
- 2.5 <u>Annual and Other Regular Meetings</u>. The annual meeting shall be held during the month of August at such time as may be determined by the Board of Directors, for the purpose of the transaction of such business as may come before the meeting. The annual meeting of the Board of Directors shall be held without other notice than this bylaw. The Board of Directors may specify by resolution the time and place, either within or without the State of Washington, for holding any other regular meetings of the Board of Directors.
- 2.6 Special Meetings. Special meetings of the Board of Directors may be called by the Board of Directors, the Chairman of the Board (if any), the President, the Secretary or any director. Notice of special meetings of the Board of Directors stating the date, time and place thereof shall be given at least ten (10) days prior to the date set for such meeting by the person or persons authorized to call such meeting, or by the Secretary at the direction of the person or persons authorized to call such meeting. The notice may be oral or written. Written notice is effective upon dispatch if such notice is sent to the director's address, telephone number, or other number appearing on the records of the corporation. If no place for such meeting is designated in the notice thereof, the meeting shall be held at the principal office of the corporation.
- 2.7 Waiver of Notice of Special Meeting. Whenever any notice is required to be given to any director of the corporation pursuant to applicable law, a waiver thereof in writing signed by the director, entitled to notice, shall be deemed equivalent to the giving of notice. Any director may waive notice of any meeting at any time. The attendance of a director at a meeting shall constitute a waiver of notice of the meeting except where a director attends a meeting for the express purpose of objecting to the transaction of any business because the meeting is not lawfully convened. Unless otherwise required by law, neither the business to be transacted at, nor the purpose of, any regular or special meeting of the Board of Directors need be specified in the notice or waiver of notice of such meeting.
- 2.8 Quorum. A majority of the number of directors specified in or fixed in accordance with these Bylaws shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of any business at any meeting of directors.
- 2.9 <u>Manner of Acting</u>. If a quorum is present when a vote is taken, the affirmative vote of a majority of directors present is the act of the Board of Directors, unless the question is one upon which a different vote is required by express provision of law of the State of Washington or of the Articles of Incorporation or of these Bylaws.
- 2.10 Participation by Conference Telephone. Directors may participate in a regular or special meeting of the Board by, or conduct the meeting through the use of, any means of communication by which all directors participating can hear each other during the meeting and participation by such means shall constitute presence in person at the meeting.

- 2.11 <u>Presumption of Assent</u>. A director who is present at a meeting of the Board of Directors at which action is taken shall be presumed to have assented to the action taken unless such director's dissent shall be entered in the minutes of the meeting or unless such director shall file his written dissent to such action with the person acting as Secretary of the meeting before the adjournment thereof or within a reasonable time thereafter. Such right to dissent shall not apply to a director who voted in favor of such action.
- 2.12 Action by Board Without a Meeting. Any action permitted or required to be taken at a meeting of the Board of Directors may be taken without a meeting if one or more written consents setting forth the action so taken, shall be signed, either before or after the action taken, by all the directors of the corporation. Action taken by written consent is effective when the last director signs the consent, unless the consent specifies a later effective date.
- 2.13 <u>Board Committees</u>. The Board of Directors may by resolution designate from among its members an executive committee or other committees, each of which must have one (1) or more members and shall be governed by the same rules regarding meetings, action without meetings, notice, waiver of notice, and quorum and voting requirements as applied to the Board of Directors. To the extent provided in such resolutions, each such committee shall have and may exercise the authority of the Board of Directors, except as limited by applicable law. The designation of any such committee and the delegation thereto of authority shall not relieve the Board of Directors, or any members thereof, of any responsibility imposed by law.
- 2.14 <u>Committee Types</u>. Committees of the Board of Directors may consist of, but are not limited to, (i) a finance committee charged with receiving, holding, administering, investing, disposing and disbursing all funds and properties of the corporation; (ii) a nominating committee charged with nominating potential directors; (iii) an investment committee charged with overseeing the corporation's investment decisions; and (iv) an executive committee charged with acting on behalf of the Board between Board meetings.
- 2.15 <u>Resignation; Removal</u>. Any director may resign at any time by delivering written notice to the Chairman of the Board, the President, the Vice-President, the Secretary, or the Board of Directors of the corporation, or by giving oral notice at any meeting of the directors. Except as provided in Paragraph 2.3 of these Bylaws, a director may be removed by a majority vote of all directors.
- 2.16 <u>Vacancies</u>. Except as otherwise provided in Paragraph 2.4, any vacancy occurring in the Board of Directors may be filled by the affirmative vote of a majority of the remaining directors though less than a quorum. A director elected to fill a vacancy shall be elected for the unexpired term of his predecessor in office.
- 2.17 <u>Compensation</u>. The directors may be paid reasonable compensation. Also, the directors shall be reimbursed actual expenses, if any, for attendance at meetings of the Board of Directors or committee thereof, provided that the expenses are reasonable.

ARTICLE 3. OFFICERS

3.1 Number. The corporation shall have a President, such number of Vice-Presidents, as the Board of Directors shall determine from time to time, a Secretary and a Treasurer, each of whom shall be appointed by the Board of Directors. Such other officers and assistant officers, including a Chairman of the Board, as may be deemed necessary or appropriate may be appointed by the Board of Directors. By resolution, the Board of Directors may designate any officer as chief executive officer, chief

operating officer, chief financial officer, or any similar designation. Any two or more offices with the exception of President and Secretary may be held by the same person.

- 3.2 Appointment and Term of Office. The officers of the corporation shall be appointed by the Board of Directors for such term as the Board may deem advisable or may be appointed to serve for an indefinite term at the pleasure of the Board. Each officer shall hold office until a successor shall have been appointed regardless of such officer's term of office, except in the event of such officer's termination of an indefinite term at the pleasure of the Board or such officer's removal in the manner herein provided.
- 3.3 <u>Resignation</u>. Any officer may resign at any time by delivering written notice to the Chairman of the Board, the President, Vice-President, Secretary or the Board of Directors, or by giving oral notice at any meeting of the Board. Any such resignation shall take effect at any subsequent time specified therein, or if the time is not specified, upon delivery thereof and, unless otherwise specified therein, the acceptance of such resignation shall not be necessary to make it effective.
- 3.4 <u>Removal</u>. Any officer appointed by the Board of Directors may be removed by the Board of Directors with or without cause. The removal shall be without prejudice to the contract rights, if any, of the person so removed. Appointment of an officer or agent shall not of itself create contract rights.
- 3.5 <u>Chairman of the Board</u>. The Chairman of the Board, if there be such an office, shall, if present, preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors, and exercise and perform such other powers and duties as may be determined from time to time by resolution of the Board of Directors.
- 3.6 President. The President shall be the principal executive officer of the corporation and, subject to the control of the Board of Directors, shall generally supervise and control the business and affairs of the corporation. In the absence of the Chairman of the Board, or if there be none, the President shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors. The President may sign deeds, mortgages, bonds, contracts, or other instruments which the Board of Directors has authorized to be executed, except in cases where the signing and execution thereof shall be expressly delegated by the Board of Directors or by these Bylaws to some other officer or agent of the corporation or shall be required by law to be otherwise signed or executed. In general, the President shall perform all duties incident to office of President and such other duties as may be prescribed by resolution of the Board of Directors. The President shall also be known as the Executive Director.
- 3.7 <u>Vice-Presidents</u>. If there shall be one or more Vice-Presidents elected and acting, in the absence of the President or in the event of his death, disability or refusal to act, the Vice-President, or in the event there shall be more than one Vice-President, the Vice-Presidents in the order designated at the time of their election, or in the absence of any designation then in the order of their election, shall perform the duties of the President. When so acting the Vice-President shall have all the powers of and be subject to all the restrictions upon the President and shall perform such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to the Vice-President by resolution of the Board of Directors.
- 3.8 Secretary. The Secretary shall keep the minutes of the proceedings of the Board of Directors, shall give notices in accordance with the provisions of these Bylaws and as required by law, shall be custodian of the corporate records of the corporation, may sign with the President, or a Vice-President, deeds, mortgages, bonds, contracts, or other instruments which shall have been authorized by resolution of the Board of Directors, and in general shall perform all duties incident to the office of Secretary and such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to the Secretary by resolution of the Board of Directors.

- 3.9 <u>Treasurer</u>. The Treasurer shall have charge and custody of and be responsible for keeping correct and complete books and records of account, for all funds and securities of the corporation, receive and give receipts for moneys due and payable to the corporation from any source whatsoever, deposit all such moneys in the name of the corporation in the banks, trust companies or other depositories as shall be selected in accordance with the provisions of these Bylaws, and in general perform all of the duties incident to the office of Treasurer and such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to the Treasurer by resolution of the Board of Directors. If required by the Board of Directors, the Treasurer shall give a bond for the faithful discharge of his duties, in such sum and with such surety or sureties as the Board of Directors shall determine.
- 3.10 <u>Assistant Officers</u>. The assistant officers in general shall perform such duties as are customary or as shall be assigned to them by resolution of the Board of Directors. If required by the Board of Directors, the assistant Treasurers shall respectively give bonds for the faithful discharge of their duties in such sums and with such sureties as the Board of Directors shall determine.

ARTICLE 4. CONTRACTS, DEEDS AND TRANSFERS

- 4.1 Execution of Contracts and Deeds. Except as otherwise provided by resolution of the Board of Directors authorizing the execution thereof, all contracts, deeds, notes, mortgages, pledges, transfers, and other written instruments binding upon the corporation shall be executed on behalf of the corporation by the President or the Secretary of the corporation.
- 4.2 <u>Voting Securities Owned by the Corporation</u>. Unless otherwise provided by resolution of the Board of Directors, each of the President or Secretary shall have full authority on behalf of the corporation to attend, to act and to vote at any meetings of the stockholders, bondholders, or other security holders of any corporation, trust or association in which the corporation may hold securities. At any such meeting such person shall possess all of the rights and powers incident to the ownership of such securities that the corporation possesses, including the authority to delegate such authority by proxy. The Board of Directors may, by resolution, confer like authority upon any other person or persons.

ARTICLE 5. FINANCES

- 5.1 <u>Loans</u>. No loans shall be contracted on behalf of the corporation and no evidences of indebtedness shall be issued in its name unless authorized by a resolution of the Board of Directors. No loans shall be made by the corporation to any officer or to any director.
- 5.2 Checks, Drafts, Etc. All checks, drafts or other orders for the payment of money, notes or other evidences of indebtedness issued in the name of the corporation shall be signed by officers or agents of the corporation and in the manner as shall from time to time be prescribed by resolution of the Board of Directors. In the absence of such provision by the Board of Directors such instrument shall be signed by any two officers of the corporation, one of whom shall be the Treasurer or Assistant Treasurer.
- 5.3 <u>Use of Income</u>. All unrestricted gifts to the corporation and income not otherwise designated by the donor for endowment or restricted purposes shall go into the general fund of the corporation and shall be used in accordance with the general purposes of the corporation.
- 5.4 Contributions and Disbursements. All contributions and other funds received by the corporation shall be deposited in a special account or accounts in such banks, trust companies or

other depositories as the Board of Directors may select. All disbursements shall be made under proper authority of the Board of Directors. All contributions, income to and disbursements of the corporation shall be recorded by the Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer or Treasurer's designee in appropriate books and records and such records shall be subject to examination at any reasonable time, upon request by any director.

5.5 <u>Budget</u>. If requested by the Board of Directors, a statement of proposed receipts, operating income and expenditures for the following year shall be prepared by the President and Treasurer and submitted to the Board of Directors at least annually. When approved by the directors, such budget shall be the authorization for expenditures and operating expenses of the corporation, subject to subsequent changes in such budget made by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE 6. RULES OF PROCEDURE

The rules of procedure at meetings of the Board shall be the rules contained in Roberts' Rules of Order on Parliamentary Procedure, as amended, so far as applicable and when not inconsistent with these Bylaws, the Articles of Incorporation, or any resolution of the Board.

ARTICLE 7. SEAL

This corporation need not have a corporate seal. If the directors adopt a corporate seal, the seal of the corporation shall be circular in form and consist of the name of the corporation, the state and year of incorporation, and the words "Corporate Seal".

ARTICLE 8. BOOKS AND RECORDS

The corporation shall keep correct and complete books and records of account, minutes of the proceedings of the Board of Directors and any committees designated by the Board of Directors, and such other records as may be necessary or advisable.

ARTICLE 9. FISCAL YEAR

The fiscal year of the corporation shall be determined by resolution adopted by the Board of Directors. In the absence of such a resolution, the fiscal year shall be the calendar year.

ARTICLE 10. COPIES OF RESOLUTIONS

Any person dealing with the corporation may rely upon a copy of any of the records of the proceedings, resolutions or votes of the Board when such records are certified by the President or Secretary.

ARTICLE 11. LIMITATION ON DISTRIBUTION OF FUNDS

Subject to the applicable law, the funds of the corporation may be distributed only for the purposes of the corporation as described in the Articles of Incorporation and to make grants to other organizations which are organized exclusively for educational, charitable or scientific purposes within the meaning of Section 50l(c)(3) of the Code and which have received a determination or ruling of tax-exempt status under Section 50l(a) of the Code, or any similar provision of the Code, from the Internal Revenue Service.

ARTICLE 12. AMENDMENTS TO BYLAWS

These Bylaws may be altered, amended or repealed, and new bylaws may be adopted, by the majority vote of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLES OF AMENDMENT OF THE ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF RICHARD AND FRANCINE LOEB FAMILY FOUNDATION

Pursuant to the Section 24.03.165 and 24.03.170 of the Revised Code of Washington, Richard and Francine Loeb Family Foundation, a Washington Nonprofit Corporation, hereby submits for filing these Articles of Amendment (the "Amendment") to the Articles of Incorporation, to be effective on September 16, 2019.

- 1. The name of the corporation is Richard and Francine Loeb Family Foundation.
- 2. The following shall be inserted as Article 6, replacing the former Article 6:

ARTICLE 6. DISTRIBUTIONS UPON DISSOLUTION

When Richard Loeb and Francine Loeb are no longer living, the Richard and Francine Loeb Family Foundation shall be dissolved, and after paying or making adequate provision for payment of all of the liabilities its assets will be distributed as follows:

- a) If the Loeb Charitable Foundation is still in existence and still qualifies for tax exempt status under Section 50l(c)(3) of the Code, all assets will be distributed to this Foundation.
- b) If the Loeb Charitable Foundation is not in existence or is no longer tax-exempt, one-half of the assets will be distributed to the Stephen and Dianne Loeb Family Foundation, and the other half will be distributed to the Loeb/Shulman Legacy Foundation or another Foundation headed by Donald K. Loeb. If any Foundation named in this paragraph is no longer in existence or no longer tax-exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code, such share of the assets shall be distributed to Temple de Hirsch Sinai or to another qualified charity or charities as specified in the minutes of the Richard and Francine Loeb Family Foundation.
- No director, trustee or officer of the corporation, nor any private individual, shall be entitled to share in the distribution of any of the corporate assets upon dissolution of the corporation or the winding up of its affairs. Upon the failure of any of the above distributions for any reason, such share of the Foundation's assets shall be distributed by the board of directors to a nonprofit fund, foundation, or corporation which is organized and duly operated exclusively for charitable, educational, religious, scientific or literary purposes, and which at that time qualifies for tax exempt status under Section 50l(c)(3) of the Code. Any assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the Superior Court of King County, Washington, for the purposes set forth in Article 3 of these Articles of Incorporation or to such organization or organizations as the Superior Court of King County shall determine to be organized and operated for similar purposes.

3. The following shall be inserted as Article 7, replacing the former Article 7:

ARTICLE 7. REGISTERED AGENT

The address of the registered office of the corporation is 1000 2nd Ave, Fl 34, Seattle, Washington 98104. The name of its registered agent at such address is Daniel Asher.

4. The following shall be inserted as Article 8, replacing the former Article 8:

ARTICLE 8. INITIAL DIRECTORS

The undersigned, acting as the incorporator of a nonprofit corporation under the provisions of the Washington Nonprofit Corporation Act (RCW 24.03) adopts the following Articles of Incorporation:

ARTICLE 1. NAME

The name of this corporation is: RICHARD AND FRANCINE LOEB FAMILY FOUNDATION.

ARTICLE 2. DURATION

The duration of the corporation is perpetual.

ARTICLE 3. PURPOSES

The corporation is organized exclusively for educational, charitable, religious, scientific and/or literary purposes, within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as may be amended from time to time (the "Code"), including, but not limited to, making grants to qualified organizations.

ARTICLE 4. PROHIBITED ACTIVITY

Notwithstanding any of the provisions of these Articles of Incorporation, the corporation shall not conduct or carry on activities not permitted to be conducted or carried on by an organization exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code or by an organization, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Code. No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to any director, officer or private individual, except that the corporation is authorized to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article 3. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office. The corporation shall not have or issue shares of stock and shall not make any disbursement of income or any loans to its directors or officers.

The corporation is prohibited from engaging in any act of self-dealing as defined in Section 4941(d) of the Code, from retaining any excess business holding as defined in Section 4943(c) of

the Code which would subject the corporation to tax under Section 4943 of the Code, from making any investments which would subject the corporation to tax under Section 4944 of the Code, and from making any taxable expenditures as defined in Section 4945(d) of the Code. If Section 4942 of the Code is applicable to the corporation, the corporation shall make distributions at such time and in such manner as not to become subject to tax on undistributed income imposed by Section 4942 of the Code.

ARTICLE 5. BYLAWS

Provisions for the regulation of the internal affairs of the corporation shall be set forth in the Bylaws of the corporation.

ARTICLE 6. DISTRIBUTIONS UPON DISSOLUTION

No director, trustee or officer of the corporation, nor any private individual, shall be entitled to share in the distribution of any of the corporate assets upon dissolution of the corporation or the winding up of its affairs. Upon dissolution or winding up of the corporation, after paying or making adequate provision for payment of all of the liabilities, all remaining assets of the corporation shall be distributed by the board of directors to a nonprofit fund, foundation, or corporation which is organized and duly operated exclusively for charitable, educational, religious, scientific or literary purposes, and which at that time qualifies for tax exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code. Any assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the Superior Court of King County, Washington, for the purposes set forth in Article 3 of these Articles of Incorporation or to such organization or organizations as the Superior Court of King County shall determine to be organized and operated for similar purposes.

ARTICLE 7. REGISTERED AGENT

The address of the initial registered office of the corporation is 1420 Fifth Avenue, Suite 3400, Seattle, Washington 98101. The name of its initial registered agent at such address is DL Services, Inc.

ARTICLE 8. INITIAL DIRECTORS

The initial board of directors shall consist of one (1) director. The name and address of the person who is to serve as initial director is:

ARTICLE 9. LIMITATION OF DIRECTOR LIABILITY

Except to the extent otherwise required by applicable law (as it exists on the date of the adoption of this Article 9 or may be amended from time to time), a director of the corporation shall not be personally liable to the corporation for monetary damages for conduct as a director, except for liability of the director (i) for acts or omissions which involve intentional misconduct by the director or a knowing violation of law by the director, or (ii) for any transaction from which the director personally receives a benefit in money, property or services to which the director is not legally entitled.

No amendment to or repeal of this Article 9 shall adversely affect any right of protection of any director of the corporation occurring after the date of the adoption of this Article 9 and prior to such amendment or repeal.

ARTICLE 10. INDEMNIFICATION

The corporation shall indemnify any director or officer of the corporation who is involved in any capacity in a proceeding (as defined in RCW 23B.08.500, as presently in effect and as hereafter amended) by reason of the position held by such person or entity in the corporation, to the full extent allowed by applicable law, as presently in effect and as hereafter amended; provided, however, that the corporation shall only indemnify a director or officer seeking indemnification in connection with a proceeding initiated by such person if such proceeding or part of a proceeding was authorized by the Board of Directors or if such proceeding was brought by a director or officer to enforce a claim for indemnification under this Article 10 and a court or an arbitrator determines that the director or officer is entitled to all of the relief claimed.

By means of a resolution or of a contract specifically approved by the Board of Directors, the corporation may indemnify an employee or agent to such degree as the Board of Directors determines to be reasonable, appropriate, and consistent with applicable law and to be in the best interests of the corporation

The Board of Directors of the corporation shall have the right to designate the counsel who shall defend any person or entity who may be entitled to indemnification, to approve any settlement, and to approve in advance any expense.

Reasonable expenses incurred by a director or officer, who is involved in any capacity in a proceeding by reason of the position held in the corporation, shall be advanced by the corporation to the full extent allowed by applicable law, as presently in effect and as hereafter amended. Reasonable expenses incurred by an employee or agent who is involved in any capacity in a proceeding by reason of the position held by such person or entity in the corporation may be, but is not required to be, advanced by the corporation prior to the final disposition of such proceeding to the full extent allowed by applicable law, as presently in effect and as hereafter amended. Expenses shall not be advanced to any director, officer, employee or agent unless that person first promises in a writing delivered to the corporation to repay all amounts advanced by the corporation in the event that it is later determined that such person is not entitled to be so indemnified.

The corporation may purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of any person who is a director, officer, employee, or agent of the corporation or is serving at the request or consent of the corporation as an officer, employee, or agent of another corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust, other enterprise, or employee benefit plan against any liability incurred by such person because of such person's status, whether or not the corporation would have the power to indemnify such person against such liability under the provisions of this Article. In addition, the corporation may enter into contracts with any director or officer of the corporation in furtherance of the provisions of this Article and may create a trust fund, grant a security interest, or use other means (including without limitation a letter of credit) to ensure the payment of such amounts as may be necessary or desirable to effect the indemnification and advances contemplated in this Article.

The right to indemnification conferred by this Article 10 shall be interpreted to conform with, and shall not create any right that is inconsistent with, applicable law, as presently in effect and as hereafter amended. To the full extent allowed by applicable law (as presently in effect and as hereafter amended), the right to indemnification conferred by this Article 10 shall continue as to a person who has ceased to be a director or officer and shall inure to the benefit of the heirs, executors, and administrators of such a person. The rights conferred in this Article 10 shall not be exclusive of any other rights which any person may have or acquire under any applicable law (as presently in effect and as hereafter amended), these Articles of Incorporation, the Bylaws of the corporation, a vote of the Board of Directors of the corporation, or otherwise.

If the Washington Nonprofit Corporation Act is amended to expand or increase the power of the corporation to indemnify, to pay expenses in advance of final disposition, to enter into contracts, or to expand or increase any similar or related power, then, without any further requirement of action by the directors of this corporation, the powers described in this Article shall be expanded and increased to the fullest extent permitted by law.

Notwithstanding any other provision of this Article 10, no indemnification shall be provided to any person if in the opinion of counsel payment of such indemnification would cause the corporation to lose its tax exempt status, if any, from federal income taxation.

No amendment to or repeal of this Article 10 shall adversely affect any right of protection of any director, officer, employee or agent for events occurring after the date of the adoption of this Article and prior to such amendment or repeal.
