

With over a century of service to the greater mercer and bucks county areas, capital he alth is comprised of 458 licensed beds, employs approximately 5,251 individuals, and gener ates over 640 million dollars in annual net patient service revenue. Capital health region al medical center and capital health medical center - hopewell are separately licensed acu te care hospitals with 237 and 221 beds; respectively.
