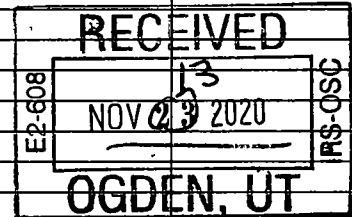

Each proposal submitted must be expressive of a project or program clearly identified with one of the Foundation's indicated fields of interest. It should include:

- A one or two-page summary of the proposal,
- Information about the applicant organization,
- Statement of need for the proposed project,
- Description of the project and rationale for its approach,
- Qualifications of the organization, the project supervisor and staff,
- Project budget, showing committed and anticipated funds,
- Organization's current operating budget,
- Description of how the project will be sustained after the grant has ended,
- List of board members and/or advisors,
- Letters of support from the applicant's board and collaborating organizations, and,
- Copy of IRS tax-exempt certification

The Foundation does not consider requests on behalf of individuals or requests to conduit organizations, which pass on funds to other organizations.
