TODAY, THE MSC TRULY PROVIDES VETERAN-TO-VETERAN SUPPORT AND CONNECTIONS. VETERANS TREATMENT COURT: MOST VETERANS ARE STRENGTHENED BY THEIR MILITARY SERVICE, BUT THEIR COMBAT EXPERIENCE HAS LEFT A GROWING NUMBER OF VETERANS WITH ISSUES SUCH AS PTSD AND TRAUMATIC BRAIN INJURY. 
