Strategy

The strategic focus of Atlantis Blue Project Foundation (ABPF) is protecting the integrity of tropical marine ecosystems that are becoming increasingly threatened due to overexploitation and overpopulation. The Foundation seeks applications for programs that will produce specific and measurable results related to ABPF's program strategy within a one- to three-year timeframe. Priority will be placed on projects that include the development and management of marine protected areas; coral reef protection; and marine mammal, sea turtle, and shark conservation and research in the Caribbean with special emphasis on The Bahamas.

Conservation success ultimately depends on the capacity of local individuals and organizations and a thorough understanding of the effect of globalization on the region. To protect the world's most biologically diverse aquatic areas, poverty and the expansion of extractive industries must be addressed. Thus we encourage our applicants to partner with organizations whose areas of expertise will complement their conservation and research proficiency including those that specialize in poverty alleviation, enterprise development, conflict management, capacity building, and food security. The success of conservation programs also relies on research that generates results that are applicable to solving complex conservation questions. We recommend that scientists involve local NGOs, universities, and/or research facilities in-situ in their research programs. This type of collaboration and mentoring will help build the capacity of the local people and develop a mechanism to share findings.

Program Focus

1) Coral Reefs

Problem Statement: Coral reefs are the most biologically diverse marine ecosystem. Unfortunately it is estimated that more than 60% of reefs are jeopardized due to human impacts including overfishing and pollution. A report released by the World Resources Institute has found that in the Caribbean alone, two thirds of coral reefs are threatened and one third is vulnerable to coastal development. Poor management practices make coral reef habitats even more susceptible to human influence. In addition, many local communities living adjacent to reefs have limited access to economic opportunities that leads to their increasing reliance on coral reef resources and further reef degradation. To reduce pressure on coral reefs, local communities must have access to more short- and long-term economic alternatives. If local communities have food security and their basic needs are met, they are much more likely to be receptive to conservation efforts.

Potential Conservation Activities

- Addressing and managing human-caused threats to coral reef viability including sediment runoff, overfishing, coastal development, tourism, pollution, cruise ship waste, sewage discharge, and destructive fishing practices
- Employing multiple strategies to manage coral reef resources
- Monitoring water quality
- Building local capacity to manage coral reef ecosystems

- Facilitating the inclusion of all stakeholders in the development of management plans
- Developing strategies for growing and reintroducing coral

Potential Research Activities

- Studying the effects of coral bleaching
- Documenting the spread of coral diseases
- Mapping impacts
- Identifying and protecting spawning aggregations
- Improving habitat quality in degraded areas

2) Marine Protected Areas

Problem Statement: Population explosion and the resulting unrelenting demand for more natural resources is leading to the unprecedented loss of biodiversity, the disappearance and fragmentation of habitat, an increase in invasive species, and climate change. All of these threats are placing increasing burdens on our remaining wild areas as well as unprecedented stress on areas already “preserved.” Creating, implementing, and managing Marine Protected Areas (MPAs) is one strategy that can be used in concert with other conservation practices to protect marine ecosystems.

Potential Conservation Activities

- Promoting the creation of a network of marine protected areas
- Establishing marine protected areas
- Developing MPA management plans
- Creating MPA zoning strategies
- Identifying and addressing impacts of coastal land use on adjacent waters
- Building the capacity for marine ecosystem management
- Ensuring MPA sustainability
- Facilitating stakeholder involvement in MPAs

Potential Research Activities

- Creating and documenting the effects of no-take zones
- Prioritizing areas to receive protection
- Analyzing the social and economic impact of MPAs
- Monitoring and evaluating resource management success

3) Marine Mammals, Sea Turtles, and Sharks

Problem Statement: Despite years of research and conservation work, relatively little is known about the more than 80 species of whales and dolphins due to difficulty in studying them in the wild. Sea turtles and sharks are also challenging to study. Yet these marine species are affected by a multitude of threats including entanglement in fishing gear, pollution, habitat destruction, collisions with ships, and overfishing. Some species are nearing extinction. And in some areas, local populations of some species are threatened or have entirely disappeared. Basic research still needs to be conducted and political, social, and economical factors that affect marine mammals, sea turtles, and sharks must be continually analyzed and addressed.

Potential Conservation Activities

- Identifying areas of habitat destruction
- Creating marine protected areas

- Studying the effects of overfishing on populations
- Establishing collaborative conservation plans

Potential Research Activities

- Assessing population sizes
- Monitoring health hazards
- Establishing accurate take levels
- Determining range and migration patterns
- Identifying feeding patterns

Conservation Approach

Within each focus areas, the following approaches should be considered:

- Field research
- Mapping and monitoring
- Sustainable development
- Public outreach
- Education programs
- Restoration
- Science-based advocacy
- Governance
- Capacity building

Program Parameters

ABPF expects applicants to specify how, under their proposed activities, they will promote achievement of the results proposed. A successful proposal will address the following key areas.

1. Focus on in-situ efforts to conserve habitats and populations within the Caribbean
2. Create results-oriented programs offering measurable results within one to three years or generate scientific findings with conservation applicability
3. Demonstrate local support
4. Partner with local NGOs, universities, local communities, and/or the private sector to transfer scientific findings and/or conservation skills or to leverage resources
5. Offer sound implementation plans, including a strategy for ensuring sustainability of the conservation effort or conservation applicability of research results
6. Develop and implement a conservation education program that will help lead to the development of a conservation ethic in the participants

Application Guidelines

Applications should be in an 8 1/2" x 11" format, single-spaced, with a minimum of 10-point type.

The submission should include the following sections:

- 1) **Cover page:** One page maximum. State title of project. Include the name and URL for the institution(s) involved in the proposal as well as the contact person from each organization along with their title, address, phone number, fax number, and email address. Program Director/Principal Investigator should sign the cover page.
- 2) **Abstract:** Two pages maximum. Give a brief overview of your organization(s) and summarize the key points of your program/research/education program including statement of need, strategy, and methodology as well as implementation and evaluation plans.

3) Program/Research Description: Twenty pages maximum. Include your statement of need, goal, strategy, objectives, approach, and measurable outcomes. Discuss how you will interface with the local community and local and/or national government officials.

4) Institutional Capacity: Three pages maximum. Demonstrate your team and organization's technical and management expertise in grant and project management including examples from success in other projects. Include a summary of your organization's expertise, past accomplishments creating and implementing similar initiatives, and your team's breadth of expertise in areas relevant to the project.

5) Project Team: Include a resume (not to exceed two pages) and job description (not to exceed one page) for key project personnel/researchers. One person must be identified as the Program Director/Principal Investigator.

6) Past Performance References: Three pages maximum. Include a table that lists the organizations that have funded similar work over the last five years. Include the funder's contact information (program officer, phone number, address, and email address), grant name, amount received, and a brief summary of the program objectives and results.

7) Management and Implementation Plan: Two pages maximum. Explain the organizational structure and staffing plan. If applicable, include all management and technical support to be received from the headquarters office. Review areas of authority and responsibility and if applicable, how partners will interact. Discuss how you will ensure timely implementation of your program/research and describe your internal procedures to ensure the early recognition and resolution of issues that would impede the progress of your work.

8) Evaluation Plan: Two pages maximum. Propose a performance monitoring and evaluation plan that demonstrates your strategy for ensuring results.

9) Project Budget: Provide a budget for each project year with accompanying budget narrative. ABPF requires organizations with annual budgets of more than \$500,000 to provide a minimum of a 20% project match.

- a. Direct Labor:** Direct salaries for each individual involved with the project. Anticipated yearly salary increases should be included.
- b. Fringe Benefits:** Based on the organization's audited fringe benefit rate.
- c. Consultants:** Include fees and travel.
- d. Supplies and Equipment**
- e. Travel:** Include the number of trips, individuals travelling, origin and destinations, and cost of each destination. Include per diem if applicable.
- f. Other Direct Costs:** Includes costs such as visas, passports, and evacuation insurance. All items should be explained in the budget narrative.
- g. Subgrantees:** If partnering on this grant, each partner should include a complete separate budget with accompanying budget narrative.

10) Audited Financial Statement: Please include your organization's last audited financial statement

11) Charitable Status: Include a copy of your country's non-profit determination letter.

ABPF will not fund:

- Litigation
- Political activities
- Fund raising
- Scholarships
- Endowments
- University overhead costs

Additional Application Guidelines

- 1) Keep the submission simple. Elaborate presentations are not desired.
- 2) Only submit the materials requested. Videos, CDs, and other collateral will not be reviewed.
