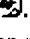










AS PART OF MUSCLE2MIND, INDIVIDUALS WITH DEMENTIA AND THEIR CAREGIVERS MEET WITH OUR EXERCISE PHYSIOLOGIST TO PARTICIPATE IN A STRUCTURED EXERCISE PROGRAM. IT CAN BE DIFFICULT FOR PEOPLE WITH DEMENTIA TO TRACK THEIR EXERCISE REGIMEN, SO MUSCLE2MIND USES A NEW STRENGTH-TRAINING MACHINE THAT COUNTS EXERCISE REPETITIONS, EASILY ADJUSTS DIFFICULTY LEVELS AND RECORDS EACH PATIENT'S PROGRESS OVER TIME. CONTRIBUTIONS FUND SCHOLARSHIPS FOR PARTICIPANTS. EVENTUALLY WE WANT TO TURN THIS EXERCISE PROGRAM INTO A LARGE RESEARCH STUDY THAT COMPARES THE OUTCOMES OF PEOPLE WITH DEMENTIA WHO PARTICIPATE IN AN EXERCISE PROGRAM WITH OTHERS WHO DO NOT. DONATIONS HAVE ALLOWED US TO FURTHER STUDY THE EFFECTIVENESS OF MINDFULNESS-BASED STRESS REDUCTION TECHNIQUES IN DEMENTIA CARE. IN THE PAST WE PILOTTED A COURSE THAT ENCOURAGED NEWLY-DIAGNOSED ALZHEIMER'S PATIENTS AND THEIR CAREGIVERS TO USE A MODIFIED VERSION OF SUCH TECHNIQUES TO HELP REDUCE THE STRESS THAT IS SO COMMON WITH A DEMENTIA DIAGNOSIS AND IMPROVE THEIR MENTAL HEALTH. OVER A THREE-YEAR PERIOD, WE WORKED WITH RESIDENTS OF A LOCAL ASSISTED LIVING FACILITY TO TEST THE EFFECTS OF AROMATHERAPY ON THE SLEEP DISRUPTION AND AGITATION LEVEL OF ALZHEIMER'S PATIENTS. THIS WORK WAS MADE POSSIBLE WITH THE HELP OF DONATIONS. DISRUPTION OF SLEEP AND AN INCREASED LEVEL OF AGITATION ARE COMMON SYMPTOMS OF ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE AND TWO OF THE MOST COMMON REASONS PEOPLE WITH MEMORY LOSS ARE PLACED INTO SKILLED NURSING FACILITIES. IT WAS BELIEVED THAT AROMATHERAPY WOULD HELP PATIENTS SLEEP BETTER, RELAX AND STAY IN THEIR HOMES LONGER. RESULTS OF OUR STUDY WERE POSITIVE: ON AVERAGE, PEOPLE WHO RECEIVED LAVENDER SLEPT 42 MINUTES MORE PER NIGHT AND HAD GREATER SLEEP EFFICIENCY THAN THOSE WHO RECEIVED THE PLACEBO.
