The total population for the MSA is estimated at 2.8 million, making the area the 21st largest metropolitan area in the United States, and is enjoying consistent population growth. This includes over 280,000 children (ages 0 - 17), representing about 21% of the region's population. The poverty rate for the MSA was reported at 11.6% in 2017, while the national rate for the same year was 12.3 percent. The median household income continues to steadily rise, too, to \$61,751, while income per capita is \$33,987. SSM Health Cardinal Glennon Children's Hospital is geographically located in St. Louis City, however, as specialty hospitals, the service area includes the St. Louis metropolitan area as well as Southern Illinois. In St. Louis County, 96.8% of children have health insurance. The child food insecurity rate is 14.8%, with 45% of those likely ineligible for assistance. Preterm births and babies with low birth rate both occur in approximately 1 of every 10 instances. Within St. Louis City limits, 96.3% of children have health insurance. The child food insecurity rate is over 23% with about 40% of those likely ineligible for assistance. Worse than the county, preterm births and babies with low birth rates both occur in about 12% of births. Through generous funding from Kohl's Department Stores and Safe Kids Worldwide, our program is dedicated to the reduction and prevention of childhood injuries, with a primary focus on child passenger safety and safe sleep. In partnership with more than 50 agencies in St. Louis and surrounding counties, we provide car seat checks and free car seats for families in need. In addition, we provide education on home safety, poison prevention, pedestrian safety, bicycle safety, safe sleep and more, along with resources for at-risk families. C. Perinatal Outreach. This program is designed to improve outcomes for mothers and babies through educational programs and quality improvement initiatives. Programs for both physicians and


