28 At the end of 2018 Delta Sculling Centers executive director was awarded USRowings prestigious 2018 Isabel Bohn award for promoting and achieving measurable success in expanding rowing opportunities for para-rowers, i e those with physical and intellectual disabilities That national recognition spurred even more community outreach success in 2019 Delta Sculling Center (DSC) continued to run five major programs our Masters sculling program for adults aged 23 and beyond, our adaptive sculling program for civilians with disabilities (OarBusters, who added two young men on the autism spectrum and a policeman with paraplegia to their ranks), a similar program for wounded warriors (Freedom Rows Delta Heroes), an indoor physical education rowing program in the public schools (the George Pocock Rowing Foundation Erg Ed Program), and DSCs year-round sculling team for 7th 12th grade girls (Girls Row Stockton) Our number of Masters athletes grew from 40 to 45 in 2019 They form the backbone of DSC, enjoying the benefits of sculling for themselves but also providing nearly all of the volunteer hours The total number of volunteer hours, approximately 640, was equal to the equivalent of four full-time employees and helped fuel and grow DSCs other four programs Volunteers received CPR and First Aid training at a Port of Stockton conference room and did their Safe Sport training electronically Several Masters rowers and coaches conducted two Sample Sculling training sessions (two Thurs evenings and Sat mornings each during the Spring and early Summer) in which they introduced newcomers to the sport of sculling They also participated with girls from our Girls Row Stockton team in Winter indoor rowing competitions in Redwood City and Sacramento as well as Spring regattas in W Sacramento and Gold River, CA All but one DSC participant set personal records at the indoor rowing championships During the summer they participated in a sprint regatta in W Sacramento and also competed in the Petaluma, CA Marathon and Half-Marathon competitions for a variety of person-powered watercraft In the Fall the Masters participated in several 5 km races in two different regattas in the Sacramento area They and their coaches finished the year with a major world-wide indoor-rowing competition twenty-two of our athletes representing all of our adult programs participated virtually in Concept2s Holiday Challenge to raise money for international non-profits designated by Concept2 They logged almost half a million meters more than they did in 2018, totaling 2,217,117 meters (the equivalent of 1,377 miles) They finished the Thanksgiving to Christmas Eve challenge 1st in the world among virtual affiliations with 38 or fewer participants One other highlight of the year for our adult rowers was DSCs invitation to Charlotte Taylor, a British sculler at the Rio Olympics, to work with interested Masters rowers on their technique during a week in August In addition to learning to scull, practicing and racing in our sport, the wounded warriors at DSC participated in other ways in our community They assisted at our fund-raising events, our boathouse maintenance day and various other social events At the Tracy Defense Distribution Depot they helped DSC Masters set up a table on Veterans Outreach Awareness Day, for which DSC President Pat Tirone received a Certificate of Appreciation DSCs military veterans also participated in a February indoor rowing military challenge, promoted by Concept2 Initiated by Delta Sculling Center in 2018 in cooperation with Stocktons public schools, the Erg Ed program expanded a great deal in 2019, thus bringing indoor rowing to approximately 2,000 youth in local schools A grant from the George Pocock Rowing Foundation in Seattle awarded our schools 20 brand new rowing machines and a specialized curriculum for physical education teachers In the Fall of 2019, our coaches led three 6-hour professional development sessions with already trained and new Erg Ed PE teachers, who even got to row on the water the second session so they would know how to connect indoor rowing to sculling in boats One of the teachers, Zeb Gromm, and DSC Founder Pat Tirone were featured by Ken Mashinchi, Fox 40 TV News https //www facebook com/watch/?v=1632571223506983 Other levels of support for the Erg Ed teachers from DSC include help with maintaining the rowing machines, scheduling their transportation from one school to another (whose teachers use them for 1-3 weeks at a time), and lending pedagogical support for the teachers, given that the sport and curriculum are new to them What began with seven teachers in Stockton during the Spring of 2018 grew to twelve in 2019 And we even expanded to nearby Lathrop, where Discovery ChalleNGe Academy, a county school connected to the National Guard, invited one of our coaches to take a group of their student cadets through the Erg Ed curriculum in three weeks In a 10-Minute Relay activity on the last day of the program, they posted the 4th best time for the mixed (women plus men) category in the 8-year history of Erg Ed Before those cadets left their 22-week program, they were invited to the DSC boathouse to learn to row on the water A peaceful day on the Delta in which they could actualize what they had learned on land was one of their favorite off-campus activities during their time at the academy On a separate day earlier in the year, their principal and staff also learned to scull as a prelude to what could be offered to their student cadets The connection with Discovery ChalleNGe Academy went two ways because their cadets as part of THEIR community outreach, assisted DSC at our annual fundraiser for the Girls Row Stockton team, which took place downtown at Stockton Collegiate International Secondary School At the cadets graduation their administrators also acknowledged all that DSC had done for DCA during the year This collaboration between DSC and DCA has continued, even during the pandemic, in 2020 and is sure to be an on-going relationship While the Erg Ed program was taking root, Delta Sculling Center established another youth program, Girls Row Stockton In 2019 this 9-member team trained after school Mon through Fri and competed (as did one of our para-rowers, one of our military veterans, and several of our Masters rowers) at the Golden State Indoor Rowing Championships in Sacramento in February All but one of the girls set personal records that day, and the same was true of our para-rower and some of the Masters The girls team also competed in six regattas in Central California throughout the year the Faultline Face-off Invitational (at San Pablo Reservoir), the Pacific Invitational (in Oakland), the USRowing SW Youth Championships (at Lake Natoma in Gold River), the Small Boat Rebellion and the Head of the Port (in West Sacramento), and the Head of the American (at Lake Natoma) The Girls Row Stockton team also did community activities, which included teaching rowing on ergometers (rowing machines) at ABLE Charter School in Stockton They also put up a display about sculling and games for children to play at the Sherwood Executive Center, where non-profits and for-profit businesses informed citizens of their services In addition, they participated (for the second consecutive year) at a Family Resource Network event for children with special needs and their family members Also, they got to meet and row with City Council member and fifth-grade teacher Christina Fugazi, who brought some of her Venture Academy students to row at DSC on Presidents Day Another pair of events enabled the DSC girls to learn to sail at the Stockton Sailing Club in exchange for young sailors at SSC to learn to scull with GRS Also, besides their end-of-year and end-of-season parties, the members of the team, all dressed in saris, attended one of their rowers brothers Punjabi 18th birthday party, which was a very informative and memorable cross-cultural experience With some members of the girls team as assistants, including one who partially because of the part she played as an asst coach got accepted to Yale University, DSC was able to hold three summer camps for girls (two week-long camps and one two-week-long camp) The camps averaged 10 girls per camp, a third of whom received full tuition scholarships to participate A few of the campers stayed on with the academic-year Girls Row Stockton team At the end of December our junior coach left because she won a scholarship to attend a 17-week internship in coding that she couldnt pass up Two coaches and a few of our Masters filled in to keep the team going in 2020 This is a position we still hope to be able to fill in the future Despite this challenge, the year ended on a high note regarding our other youth program, Erg Ed Working with the Erg Ed PE teachers during the Fall of 2019 resulted in a plan to run the first-ever indoor rowing championshi (Grants \$ 111,838) If this amount includes foreign grants, check here . . . ☐	28a
