(COMPANION ANIMALS) HSI has permanently closed 15 dog meat farms in South Korea since 2014 and has rescued and rehomed over 2,000 dogs from these farms. During the closure of the 15th dog meat farm, 90 dogs were rescued and although this was one of the smaller rescues HSI has done, this rescue had a large impact regarding exposure to the issue. For the first time, HSI had Korean celebrities visit a farm while it was being closed. A top Korean TV station, KBS, filmed their visits. Further, British Ambassador Smith endorsed HSI's work in South Korea and said: "We have been delighted to host a reception for Humane Society International at the Embassy, to bring attention to their work tackling the animal welfare problems of the dog meat trade. HSI's approach is commendable and clearly effective, working collaboratively with dog farmers keen to leave the trade behind them, and supporting their willing transition to alternative humane livelihoods. We are delighted to see progress being made for dogs here in Korea." (CONTINUED FROM PART III, LINE 4A) And the Victoria Derbyshire Programme on BBC Two and BBC News Channel highlighted HSI's work in South Korea and said in a statement, "popularity for dog meat in South Korea has declined in recent years, as pet ownership rises and new generations have different attitudes to eating domestic animals. Humane Society International is a charity that's been working together with dog farmers since 2014 to close their farms and find the farmed dogs new homes." Other highlights of the success in HSI's dog meat campaign in South Korea in 2019 are as follows: Authorities shut down the Gupo dog meat market, which was notoriously known for being one of the country's largest markets: 80 dogs were rescued. And Seoul's last three dog meat shops agreed to end dog slaughter on-site, following over a year of campaigning from Seoul's Mayor Park Won-soon and the South Metropolitan Government, and five years of work by HSI in the region. The capital city has declared their city is now free of d

(ANIMAL TESTING) In Brazil, regulations governing the testing of pesticides were modified, including the abolition of a year-long poisoning test that was being performed on dogs. HSI's intervention led to the release of 36 beagle dogs that were enduring this pesticide test. This one-year dog pesticide-poisoning test has now also been abolished

globally. Also globally, Avon & Estee Lauder Companies both joined HSI's #BeCrueltyFree campaign, calling for a worldwide ban on cosmetics testing on animals. And Julia Fentem, from Unilever, received the 2019 Corporate Consciousness Award for Unilever's partnership with HSI's Research & Toxicology team to end cosmetic testing on

animals.

Highlights included: In Thailand, Tesco-Lotus, one of the largest retailers in Thailand, announced a cage-free policy

Africa, stated that they will only provide financial services to clients using cage-free production systems for livestock. This is the first time a financial institution has announced such a policy.

(MOET) to include a comprehensive threatened species curriculum (which includes lessons on several threatened species including pangolins. ltigers, rhinos, elephants, primates, hornbills, and more) into the national primary school extracurricular lessons. (Code:) (Expenses \$ 392,246 including grants of \$ 212.065) (Revenue \$ Confronting Cruelty HSI responds to disasters around the world by providing rescue efforts, medical equipment/supplies and food. HSI responded

to assist animals during the following in 2019; in Malawi and Mozambigue, after Cyclone Idai's devastation, HSI provided veterinary care and supplies to dogs, cats, and farm animals. In the Bahamas, HSI provided relief from Hurricane Dorian by assisting with search & rescue of lost/displaced pets, assisting with care of animals that needed medical attention, and assisting with transport of animals that were being cared for at a temporary shelter. 



Their anno uncement follows an intense ivory trade debate at CITES. In Washington, DC, HSI and The Hu mane Society of the United States (HSUS) released findings of an undercover investigation revealing a lucrative ivory trade in Washington, DC. Legislation has been introduced in the e Council of the District of Columbia that would prohibit sales in DC of certain ivory products and products made from rhino horn. In the United Kingdom, Snow + Rock, a major retai I chain specializing in outdoor wear with over twenty stores across the UK, adopted a no fur policy, following outreach and conversations with HSI. And Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II announced she is going fur-free. In Vietnam, official approval was received from the Vietnam Ministry of Education and Training (MOET) to include a comprehensive threatened species curriculum (which includes lessons on several threatened species including pangolins, tigers, rhinos, elephants, primates, hornbills, and more) into the national primary school extracurricular lessons.

HSI responds to disasters around the world by providing rescue efforts, medical equipment/supplies and food. 2) Wildlife — HSI wildlife programs cover a wide range of issues from campaigning against the commercial al killing of wildlife (Canadian seals, sharks, turtles, whales, rhinos, elephants, trophy hunted species) to ending trade in wildlife and wildlife parts to resolving human-wildlife conflict in a humane manner (e.g. elephants in southern Africa, badgers and rodents in the UK). 3) Farm Animals – HSI has obtained commitments from several companies (including hotel chains, hospitality companies and food companies) in multiple countries to source the ir egg inventories from 100% cage-free egg producers. 4) Confronting Cruelty – HSI works to confront cruelty on multiple fronts.
