THE MARGARET PAXTON MEMORIAL TRUST OWNS A 17-ACRE PROPERTY IN LEESBURG, VA THAT SUPPORTS THE WORK OF OTHER NON-PROFITS SERVING CHILDREN IN NEED IN OUR COMMUNITY. THE PAXTON CAMPUS IS CURRENTLY HOME TO 'THE ARC OF LOUDOUN', A NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATION THAT PROVIDES DIRECT SERVICES TO MORE THAN 100 CHILDREN AND ADULTS WITH DISABILITIES THROUGH A K-12 SPECIAL NEEDS SCHOOL, AN INCLUSIVE PRESCHOOL, AN ADVOCACY CENTER AND A NEWLY-OPERATING BEHAVIOR CLINIC THAT PROVIDES BEHAVIOR THERAPY SERVICES TO CHILDREN IN THE COMMUNITY. THE TRUST ALSO UTILIZES THE CAMPUS PROPERTY TO SERVE CHILDREN IN NEED IN THE COMMUNITY THROUGH TWO FREE FAMILY FOCUSED EVENTS, THE 'SPRING FLING' AND 'FUN ON THE FOURTH'. IN 2019, THE TRUST BEGAN A PARTNERSHIP WITH INMED USA, TO START THE DEVELOPMENT PHASE OF CONSTRUCTING A PRIVATE HIGH SCHOOL WITH A FOCUS ON VOCATIONAL TRAINING FOR AT-RISK TEENS THAT INCLUDES AN EDUCATIONAL AQUAPONICS SYSTEM WITH A GREENHOUSE ON THE PAXTON CAMPUS IN LEESBURG. THE INITIATIVE WILL SERVE CHILDREN AND YOUTH WITH PHYSICAL, MENTAL AND ECONOMIC NEEDS, AS WELL AS THOSE WHO DON'T ADAPT WELL TO TRADITIONAL CLASSROOM ENVIRONMENTS THROUGH VOCATIONAL TRAINING ESPECIALLY IN THE BURGEONING FIELD OF ADAPTIVE AND SUSTAINABLE AGRICULTURE.
