

Approximately, 63.9% of the area's children and youth live in households with incomes at or above 200 percent of the poverty level (US Census Bureau, 2011). A slightly larger number of children and youth in Florida (24.9%) live below 100% of the FPL when compared to the national rate of children in poverty (22.5%). Based on the US Census bureau (2011), children in Florida are more likely to be uninsured or publicly insured (53.1%), and less likely to be privately insured (59.1%) than children and youth nationally (44.7% and 66.2%, respectively). The majority of children and youth in Florida are covered through private, largely employer-sponsored, health insurance. About 32.1% of children and youth in Florida are covered by public health insurance (us census bureau, 2011), a percentage which is slightly higher than the nationa


