

In addition, THR does daily cash sweeps of all controlled tax exempt entity cash accounts, As a result, THR has numerous daily transactions with controlled tax exempt entities, none of which fall within the scope of IRC Section 512(b)(13). A management fee is charged for the centralized services and reported on Form 990, Part VII, Section B as a professional services fee. Transactions with related tax exempt organizations falling within the meaning of centralized services as described above, are not listed on schedule R, Part V, Line 2.
