Engagement at this stage can lead to stronger community support and involvement throughout the community health improvement plans and processes effort. Community health improvement efforts are most effective when community members are active in addressing their own needs and visions for a healthy community. Particular attention to groups with unique health or social issues who are often underrepresented in community planning efforts can be accomplished through direct participation or through their proxies. For example, it may not be appropriate to directly collect information from victims of domestic abuse or people experiencing homelessness or drug addiction for the CHNA but working with proxies or service providers concerned about th

TMC for the most part, however, serves the needs of the population by building coalitions and partnering with those organizations that provide expertise to those struggling with behavioral health needs. TMC works closely with Palo Verde Behavioral Heal th, which shares our campus. Palo Verde assists in evaluating patients who present to TMCs Emergency Department to ensure a safe disposition and treatment. They also work closely with TMC when needs are identified on the inpatient unit. In addition to screening for suici de and domestic violence in our inpatient areas, our outpatient areas similarly perform su icide screenings at access points for patients at high risk for suicide because of struggl es with wounds, pain or sleep.TMCOne has recently added a pediatric behaviorist to help ad dress theincreasing needs of our pediatric and adolescent patients. Additionally, all pati ents complete a PHQ-9 screening and receive follow up specific to any self-identified depr ession or suicide ideation. TMC Hospice offers bereavement services for those experiencing loss, aswell as a community grief group for those experiencing those emotions. While TMC does not have a specific addiction unit, we readily refer to community addiction services and provide patient education around opioidabuse. These services include: A consulting doctor who specializes in seeing patients with opioid abuse routinely works with TMC patients, a s needs are identified through case management. TMC has a partnership with Connections Ari zona in which patients andfamilies struggling with substance abuse are provided a liaison to assist with education and support to identify appropriate resources. The Newborn Intens ive Care Unit works closely with CODAC Health, Recovery and Wellness to provide substance a buse services on site forparents of babies born with drug exposure and we have a separate unitdesigned specifically to care for these babies with such unique needs. TMC is working with Old Pueblo to secure two medical respite bedsfor patients struggling with behavioral health, substance abuse andhomelessness so they have a place to recover from complex

conditions. TMC has been actively working to find alternate methods of pain controlthat does not include the use of opioids, offering services such asbiofeedback, interventional procedur es and injections.

TMC was at the forefront of eff orts to collectively address opioiddependency and substance abuse disorder. In addition to supporting acommunity visioning session with 75 community leaders, hosting a national expert to share expertise on combating the epidemic, and collaborated with other medical profe ssionals to determine appropriate treatment guidelines for opioid usage for chronic pain in emergency settings. The work around opioid work culminated in a lawsuit against opioid m anufacturers to hold them accountable for loss of lives and the broader cost of mitigating the epidemic.TMC is actively working on workplace violence strategies from providing de-es calation strategies to staff to establishing a contract with patients that shares expectations as well as their rights. In a unique project, TMC was proud to work with CODAC to open theConnie Hillman Family Foundation House, providing treatment for mothersrecovering from substance abuse. The 16-unit complex provides aftercaretreatment, pediatric and maternal care, life-skills training and other services to help women be successful in their recover v, to keep families together and to provide a bridge to independence. 
