JUDE NEIGHBORHOOD HEALTH CENTERS FEDERALLY QUALIFIED HEALTH CENTER) PROVIDES MEDICAL, DENTAL, VISION, AND MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES TO LOW INCOME, VULNERABLE, AND UNDERSERVED COMMUNITIES IN CENTRAL ORANGE COUNTY. SWEET BEGINNINGS PROGRAM- A PREVENTIVE HEALTH MODEL FOR PREGNANT WOMEN WITH GESTATIONAL DIABETES. PROVIDES TEACHING, NUTRITION COUNSELING, INSTRUCTION ON HOW TO USE MEDICAL EQUIPMENT, AND MAINTENANCE OF BLOOD SUGARS. 
