The Lin Continental Foundation ("LCF") has undergone a change in its state tax exempt status as a result of an audit by the California Franchise Tax Board.

On or about November 1, 2019, LCF's status as an entity exempt from state income tax was revoked by the Franchise Tax Board. LCF's state tax exempt status was retroactively revoked as the audit examination by the Franchise Tax Board concluded that LCF has non-exempt purposes, including the ownership of a partnership interest constructing a housing project, benefits to private individuals including salary and medical insurance payments and inurement of LCF's net income through the reimbursement of personal expenses.

LCF's management does not necessarily agree with the determinations of the Franchise Tax Board examination; however, in the interests of avoiding the possibility of a protracted and costly dispute with the Franchise Tax Board, LCF chose not to contest the determinations of the audit examination. LCF has decided that it will, in coordination and conjunction with the California Attorney General's Office (which has legal oversight of non-profit entities chartered or formed under the laws of the State of California), wind down its operations, and distribute its remaining assets to other 501(c)(3) organizations, as the California Attorney General's Office may direct.

After LCF's state tax exempt status was revoked, LCF's representatives attempted to contact the IRS Exempt Organizations Determinations Unit to discuss what steps LCF should take to notify the IRS of the change in LCF's state tax exemption. Due to mandatory shelter-in-place orders due to COVID-19, LCF's representatives had to wait until the Exempt Organizations Determinations Unit reopened. After the Exempt Organizations Determinations Unit reopened, LCF's representatives contacted the Determinations Unit on several occasions and were informed that they should include an attachment statement to the Form 990-PF for LCF to notify the IRS of the change in state tax exemption.

LCF is presently in talks with representatives of the California Attorney General's Office to begin the process of winding down and concluding LCF's operations.
