LSCH was the State of Washington's first new hospital construction since 1979. The hospital opened in August 2005 with 165 licensed beds, all of which are single occupancy. LSCH provides a full array of hospital services, including surgery, diagnostics, inpatient and outpatient medical services, neonatal intensive care unit, pediatric, obstetrical, and emergency services. LSCH utilizes an electronic information system for medical records and physician order entry. Physicians are able to complete their entire patient records electronically and can remotely access patient records, including diagnostic images. In support of its mission, LSCH voluntarily provides medically necessary patient care services that are discounted or free of charge to persons who have insufficient resources and/or who are uninsured. During fiscal year 2020, LSCH provided financial assistance on approximately 11,998 patient accounts (of which 1,092 accounts received discounts totaling 100% of costs) and resulted in LSCH incurring roughly \$6,557,600 in uncompensated costs associated with this program. In addition to charity care, LSCH provides services under various states' Medicaid programs for financially needy patients Medicare beneficiaries, and other government programs for which the cost of treating these patients exceeds the government payments received. During fiscal year 2020, LSCH incurred approximately \$34,367,100, \$29,623,900 and \$914,400 in uncompensated costs attributable to Medicaid, Medicare and other government programs respectively. LSCH also provides a variety of other community benefit activities such as medical education, donations to other charitable entities, research, and other health improvement services, which totaled roughly \$2,032,850 during fiscal year 2020.LSCH is part of Legacy, which collectively provided over \$51 million, \$193 million, and \$5 million in uncompensated care attributable to its financial assistance, Medicaid, Medicare, and other government programs, respectively, in fiscal year 2020. In additio

In accordance with UPMIFA and board policy, assets classified as permanent endowmen ts in accordance with UPMIFA and board policy, assets classified as permanent endowmen ts in accordance with donor intent are only utilized for current period expenditures to the extent that earnings on the endowment exceed identified expenditures on which to apply those earnings, the earnings are classified as temporarily restricted net assets. Legacy has adopted investment and spending policies for endowment assets to provide a predictable stream of funding to programs supported by its endowment and to maintain the value of the endowment assets. Asset allocation is reviewed quarterly with respect to: i) Legacy's toler ance for risk based on its financial condition and need for cash from investments to support operations; ii) expected asset class return, risk and correlation characteristics; iii) changes in accounting guidance or tax law and iv) changes in bond covenants or other rest rictions. Legacy's spending practices are intended to comply with donor's wishes and meet a II applicable laws and regulations. Spending must be for a purpose that is consistent with the documented intent of the donor, and may not exceed the amounts annually determined by Legacy. Factors that are considered in addressing the annual spending allocation are: i) market value of the fund relative to the principal of the gift and ii) the level of spending in prior years. The results of the assessment can be found at www.LegacyHealth.org.In Legacy Salmon Creeks previous CHNA, we identified access to health care, chronic disease, mental health, substance use disorder, health literacy, and education and youth as our CHNA priorities. Since this last report, we have invested time, resources, and funding in programs and services we believed would have an impact on these needs. A \$10 million Community Health Fund was established in 1998 by the Legacy Health Board. The funding is supported by operating revenue on an annual basis. Every partner organization receiving funding meets the needs identified in the CHNA. The region served by Legacy Salmon Creek Hospital (LSCH), along with most of Washington, is experiencing significant challenges in population growth, economic development, education and health care. Recognizing that social and economic determinants impact health, LSCH has

been and will remain committed to addressing these issues to improve the health of all residents in the community, including equity among ethnically diverse populations.

990 Schedule H, Supplemental Information Form and Line Reference Explanation Part VI, Line 3 - Patient Education of LSCH employs financial counselors and social workers that assist patients in obtaining coverage for their Eligibility for Assistance healthcare needs. This includes assistance with workers compensation, motor vehicle accident policies, COBRA, veterans' assistance, LSCH's financial assistance program, and public assistance programs, such as Medicaid. The criteria for financial assistance under LSCH's program is determined based on eligibility for insurance coverage, household income, qualified assets, catastrophic medical events, or other information supporting a patient's inability to pay for medically necessary services provided. Specifically, the LSCH Financial Assistance Program provides an uninsured discount of 35% to patients who are selfpay. Further discounts are available for patients, on a sliding scale, whose household income is less than 400% of the federal poverty level or roughly \$104,800 for a family of four in Portland, Oregon. For patients whose household income is at or below 300% of the federal poverty level, a full subsidy is available. In addition to the household income criteria, the patients' qualified assets (e.g. 25% of household assets), and other catastrophic or economic circumstances are considered in determining eligibility. In addition to financial counselors and social workers, LSCH makes every effort to communicate its Financial Assistance Program to patients. This includes signage in main admitting areas of each hospital and brochures explaining financial assistance in all patient care areas, translated for patients/individuals with limited English proficiency (LEP). Financial counselors are available to assist patients in understanding and applying for available resources, including the LSCH Financial Assistance Program. LSCH's website also has information about the availability of financial assistance. LSCH offers financial assistance customer service Monday through Friday, as well as the availability of voice mail so patients can leave confidential, detailed messages during non-business hours. Patients are encouraged to sign up for MyHealth, a secure online tool to access their medical record. Using their MyHealth account they can correspond with a financial counselor via email. Finally, all of Legacy's billing statements include information regarding the availability of financial assistance. If LSCH requires the use of a collection agency, those agencies are required to provide a telephone number that patients can call to request financial assistance.In 2010, Legacy Health established the Health Literacy initiative. Nearly all Legacy employees are touch points to patients and families and health literacy is involved in every touch point. What is health literacy? The Institute of Medicine defines health literacy as the capacity to obtain, understand, and process basic health information and services needed to make appropriate health decisions. In short, health literacy is the ability to understand and act on health information. Nearly half of the U.S. adult population has a low level of health literacy. Patients with low health literacy are less likely to comply with treatment, less likely to seek preventive care and twice as likely to be hospitalized. Quality, safety and cost are all affected by a patient's inability to understand medical instructions and to explain their symptoms/issuesLegacy's employees are learning and practicing new way of communicating with patients using health literacy tools such as universal precautions, plain language and teach back methods. Annual education is provided to all billing and admitting staff so they can be kept informed of and speak with knowledge about current financial assistance policies and options. LSCH provides copies of the latest policies in main admitting areas, as well as with the hospital financial counselor, online via the website and through MyHealth.Since 2008, the four county metro area health delivery systems (encompassing all hospitals in the area) and safety net clinics have partnered to establish a seamless, coordinated program to provide care for the low income uninsured, Project Access. This program enables low income uninsured patients to receive continuity of care in earlier stages of acuity due to the collaboration among 3,000 providers and all health systems. Part VI, Line 4 - Community LSCH opened in 2005 in north Clark County between the cities of Vancouver to the south and Battle Information Ground and Ridgefield to the north in an unincorporated area known as Salmon Creek and Hazel Dell. The primary service area is defined as the five mile radius, but due to the hospital's location in an unincorporated area and since there are only two hospitals in the county, the county is the commonly used primary service area composition. This definition extends from the Columbia River on the south, north to La Center, west to Vancouver Lake and east to Camas. The primary service area extends from the Columbia River on the south, to La Center in the north, Vancouver Lake in the west and Camas in the east. The primary service area includes the cities of Vancouver, Battle Ground, Ridgefield and Camas. Vancouver and Camas are industrial, commercial and residential communities while and Battle Ground and Ridgefield are primarily residential. Zip codes for the primary service area include: 98601, 98603, 98604, 98606-07, 98616, 98622, 98629, 98642, 98660-68, 98671, 98674-75, and 98682-87. The population of the LSCH primary service area was estimated to be 453,819 in 2017, having increased 30.9 percent from 2000-2015. It is one of the fastest growing counties in the state and an estimated growth of 7.14 percent is projected by 2022. Although the racial and ethnic population of Clark County is predominantly white (non-Hispanic/Latino), the demographics of Clark County continue to diversify. Notably, the foreign-born population in Clark County increased 16.4 percent from 2005 to 2014, with the Hispanic/Latino population increasing 98 percent from 2000 to 2010 the highest rate of change of any ethnic population. The LSCH primary service area was 82.2 percent non-Hispanic white, 10.2 percent Hispanic, 2.2 percent African American, 5.9 percent Asian and Pacific Islander, and .96 percent Native American in 2017. While still a small population relative to the entire metro area, specific geographic areas are experiencing significant growth in the Slavic population, including Clark County. Slavs are counted in the non-Hispanic white population, but they have a distinct cultural identity and their socioeconomic status is generally lower than other (non-Hispanic) white populations. Russian and other Slavic languages (Czech, Slovak and Ukrainian) are among the top five languagesspoken at home in Clark County (0.8 percent).Clark County had a median household income (MHI) of \$61,741 with 9.3 percent of the population living below poverty. In contrast, Washington County in Oregon had a MHI at \$66,136 with 8.7 percent below poverty, followed by Clackamas County at \$65,316 with 6.8 percent below poverty and Multnomah at \$53,660 with 12.8 percent below poverty. County-level race and ethnicity data is not available, but a sampling of school districts within service areas reveals distinct differences. Two main school districts in the LSCH service area show the non-Hispanic white cohort to have a graduation rate higher than African Americans, Hispanics, Asian Pacific Islanders and Native Americans. The Dignity Health and Truven Health Community Needs Index (CNI) is accepted as the national standard in identifying communities with health disparities and comparing relative need. Legacy Salmon Creeks community health focus is the highest Community Needs Index zip codes in its service area which include: 98660-West Vancouver, 98661-Downtown Vancouver, 98663-Rosemere East Vancouver and 98665-Hazel Dell Peace Health SW Washington Medical Center is the only other hospital that serves the LSCH primary service area. In 2013, Kaiser Permanente entered into a 7 year contract with LSCH. According to the contract, LSCH became the new partner hospital for Kaisers 100,000 members in Clark County. The service area includes a Medically Underserved

Areas (MUA) in central Vancouver. There is also one non-public sector Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC) operated by SeaMar and one long-standing volunteer-based safety net Free Clinic in Vancouver. The Clark County Health Department does not operate primary care services directly. A local non-profit, Project Access Clark County, links uninsured low income individuals to no-cost healthcare services. All of the health systems in the metro area are very involved with this program. Legacy Health provides cash donations as well as clinical services. While the Affordable Care Act has significantly lowered the uninsured rate in Washington State, longstanding income disparities in the Legacy Salmon Creek service area underscore the ongoing need for safety net services which are detailed in the separate CHIP document which can be found on the organizations website. In FY20, LSCH provided \$6.5 million in charity care; total

unreimbursed costs of care for people in need amounted to \$41.8 million.

	meetings. Clinical staff is involved with local communities through many child safety programs. In 1986, nurses in member hospital Legacy Emanuels Level I Trauma Center developed the Trauma Nurses Talk Tough (TNTT) program. The American Hospital Association awarded the TNTT program its NOVA Award. In addition, Legacy staff members conducted 541 free checks to show parents how to properly install car seats. Last year, Legacy staff fit and distributed 5,152 low cost helmets and safety gear to children, of which 1,381 were donated. Legacy staff also provide new parents with training to reduce the incidences of shaken baby syndrome as well as an education and awareness program about window safety (to prevent children falling from upper stories). The COVID-19 pandemic swept across the U.S. in the last few months of FY20. The COVID-19 pandemic presented unforeseen challenges within our communities and heightened the need for community benefit. The health and economic impacts of this crisis continue to grow and evolve. The economic implications of COVID-19 have constrained the availability of resources and required Legacy to redirect funding and develop new strategies in response to emerging community needs. As we enter unprecedented times, we will continue to leverage community collaborations to identify new ways to engage community, and maximize resources and impact.

The Legacy Board is comprised of community and business leaders as well as representatives of the medical staff. The LSCH medical staff is open, with physicians submitting credentialing information reviewed according to LSCH policies and standards. In 1998, the Legacy Health Board approved a \$10 million Community Health Fund from operating revenue to address major community health issues. The Fund aims to provide annual grants to community-based programs addressing racial and ethnic disparities and inequities. The Community Health Fund has provided 52 grants since 1998 totaling over \$9.7 million. In addition to our Community Health Fund contributions, \$435,000 in grant funding was awarded to community-based organizations in Clackamas, Clark, Marion and Washington counties, to strengthen organizational capacity and support programs and initiatives that address the social determinants of health and health equity, focused on early childhood education and meaningful employment. In 2010, Legacy

Health established the Health Literacy initiative. Communication with patients such that patients both understand and can act on the information required of and provided to them is critical to their health outcomes. For almost a decade, Legacy Health led the way in bringing high-quality health literacy experts to Portland to support organizations in better serving our communities through health literate communication tools and best practices shared at our annual Legacy Health Oregon & SW Washington Health Literacy Conference. Due to COVID-19, we had to cancel the 2020 conference and have since decided to retire the Oregon & SW Washington Health Literacy Conference to refocus efforts to continue to align with the needs of our communities. Legacy continues to be committed to health literacy and community engagement focused on equity and inclusion. Recognizing that education, employment and income inequities exist for communities of diversity, and that health professions are lacking in diversity, Legacy established the Health Occupation Profession and Education - HOPE program (formerly Youth Employment in Summer-YES). Between 5 and 15 students of ethnically diverse communities receive paid summer employment in departments where they work with health professionals and earn college scholarships between \$3,000 and \$10,000 annually. Students must remain in school and pursued health careers in order to continue in the program. Some students remain in the program as long as seven years and graduated with degrees in a variety of healthcare fields. The vast majority of the students are the first in the families to go to college. While the HOPE students were unable to work due to supplemental employment pauses due to COVID-19, we were able to provide students with their education scholarships. In addition to the Community Health Fund, Legacy provided cash donations to local health

and human service, education, economic development and civic organizations. Donations focus on organizations with year-round relationships through programs and board representationspecifically focused organizations addressing disparities. A few examples include Columbia River Mental Health Services, The

> Childrens Center, Free Clinic of SW Washington and NAMI Clark County. In addition, Legacy Health lab services provided more in-kind services to the local safety net clinic in Battle Ground, Washington.
