THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE SHALL ANNUALLY REVIEW, USING COMPARATIVE DATA, AND APPROVE COMPENSATION FOR THE PRESIDENT, THE OFFICERS AND THE KEY EMPLOYEES OF THE FOOD BANK. ANY ACTIONS OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE SHALL BE RATIFIED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS AT ITS MEETING NEXT FOLLOWING THE ACTION.
