IEL HOSTED ITS FIRST NATIONAL FAMILY AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT CONFERENCE IN CINCINNATI IN 2014 WITH OVER 500 ATTENDEES. MOST RECENTLY, THE SIXTH ANNUAL CONFERENCE IN JULY 2019 IN RENO, NEVADA UNDER THE THEME OWNING OUR MOVEMENT, MAXIMIZING OUR IMPACT. OVER 1450 EDUCATORS, PARENTS, DISTRICT AND STATE FCE LEADERS, COMMUNITY ORGANIZERS, TEACHERS AND OTHER EDUCATORS, AND OTHERS WERE IN ATTENDANCE, AND COMMITTED TO SHARING HIGH IMPACT, EVIDENCE-BASED FAMILY AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT STRATEGIES.
