Montana. The Hospital provides quality healthcare regardless of race, creed, sex, national origin, handicap, age, or ability to pay. Although reimbursement for services rendered is critical to the operation of the Hospital, it is recognized that not all individuals possess the ability to purchase these essential services. It is the Hospital's mission to serve the surrounding area by providing healthcare services and healthcare education to all community members. During the year ended June 30, 2020, the Hospital provided \$255,143 of medical services, based on charges, to individuals who were determined unable to purchase such services under the Hospital's charity care policy and guidelines. In addition to free care and/or subsidized care, care is also provided at below cost rates to persons covered by governmental programs. Recognizing its mission to the community, services are provided to both Medicare and Medicaid patients. The unreimbursed value of providing care to these patients was \$47,235,162 for the year ended June 30, 2020. During the fiscal year ended June 30, 2020 the Hospital provided over 3,100 days of hospital services. The nursing home provided over 29,000 resident days during the year. The Hospital also provides community care and services through many healthcare activities and programs provided to support the community. Part VI, Line 2:	In addition to conducting Community Health Needs Assessments, Northern Montana Hospital assesses the needs of the communities it serves in several ways. NMH reviews the top ten diagnosis in it's two Rural Health Clinics at least quarterly. We also monitor "left without being seen" patients in the Emergency Department. We monitor blood pressure and tobacco and alcohol status with every patient visit. We also have a Diabetes Prevention program that meets at least monthly with enrolled patients. In addition, we have a Chronic Care Management program in which our two Care Coordinators monitor high risk patients via phone calls and a software program called Chronic Care IQ that patients in the program interact with and record their vital signs back to NMH regularly.

Section B. Line 11: Priority Issue One: Opioid AbuseNMH Health leaders identified opioid abuse as their most serious health concern. While not specifically identified durin a the data collection process, there is a National focus on combatting the opioid epidemic. The opioid addiction crisis is now declared as a public health emergency. Behavioral Ris k Factors also support this concern as an area on which the hospital needs to focus. Presc ription drug use (including opioids) is 6% higher in Hill County than in Montana State. Pr escription opioid related drug overdose deaths make-up 43.7% of Montana Residents; based on death certificates from 2000-2015 (Office of Epidemiology and Scientific Support, Montan a DPHHS). During an 11 month period 36 patients presented to NMH with opioid dependency or opioid overdose as their primary diagnosis. Another 18 patients participated in the NMCDT S program for treatment of their opioid addiction. In FY 2020, the Planning Grant to support prevention of and treatment for substance abuse disorders ended. A joint decision with the Northcentral Montana Hospital Alliance (NMHA) and Northern Montana Hospital to not apply for the sustaining grant was made. The NMHA pursued a grant for Behavioral Health Integr ation and Chronic Care Management. NMH pursued

and obtained a grant for Chronic Care Manag ement Quality Initiatives. A MedSafe is accessible to the community in the fover of the se cond floor of Northern Montana Hospital. MedSafe is a disposal system for unused and expir ed medication. This system accepts controlled (Schedules II-V), non-controlled and over-th e-counter medicines and meets the requirements of the DEA Controlled Substances Act. Our p romotion of MedSafe through press releases, website and Facebook postings increases public awareness about the dangers of prescription misuse and the importance of proper storage and disposal of unused medications. At the Rural Health Clinics a standard question of "Do y ou have any substance abuse issues" is being asked as part of the screening processes. Thi s is true for adults as well as adolescents. Priority Issue 2: Substance AbuseSubstance Abu se statistics for Hill County led group health leaders to choose substance abuse, specific ally; illegal drug and alcohol abuse as an area of concern will also be addressed in the c urrent planning cycle. Hill County residents who responded to the community health survey also indicated that addressing illegal drug abuse and alcohol abuse was of high importance. Based on the County Health Rankings of 2017, alcohol-impaired driving deaths in Hill Cou nty ranked 12% higher than the state of Montana, During FY 2020 NMH approached substance ab use

through focused efforts which included community events, sponsorships and educational outreach

NMH also offers Prime for Li fe classes to the Hi-Line community. Prime for Life is a program designed for people who m ight be making high-risk choices and is court mandated for MIPs and DUIs in Hill County. I n response to the COVID-19 crisis, NMH was able to offer Tele-Medicine in lieu of in-perso n visits. As substance abuse counseling is considered an essential service, NMH will be able to continue offering Tele-Medicine to patients in circumstances where transportation is an issue. Parenting Montana provides easy-to-use parenting tools to support children's su ccess from kindergarten through the teen years. NMH participates in this program by displa ying signage, providing handouts and advertising on our flat screen televisions and Facebo ok. Two areas of special significance discussed in this program are "Establishing Rules for Alcohol and "Mixed Messages About Alcohol." These programs are especially beneficial in helping to de-glamorize alcohol consumption. Priority Issue 3: Tobacco UseTobacco abuse is also considered a top priority issue amongst the hospitals group health leaders. The CDC r eported in 2013 a Hill County tobacco use rate of 30%; the state-wide rate at that time was 18%. 78.5% of the Hill County community health survey respondents ranked tobacco use as an issue within our community. In FY 2020, NMH pursued and obtained a grant for Chronic Car e Management Quality Initiatives to improve patient healthcare outcomes focusing on clinic al indicators for management of chronic diseases including a reduction in obesity and smok ing. Primary Care Providers at the Rural Health Clinics conduct tobacco use screening assessments routinely as part of the office visit. Patients aged 12 and older are screened; if tobacco use is present, they are offered assistance from the Montana Quitline by nursing staff. And smoking cessation is necommended by the p

the use of tobacco, alcohol and other illegal substances. NMH is an active participant in the summer HELP Camp Christen Obresley represents NMH at the North Montana Tobacco-Fre e Coalition. The North Montana Tobacco-Free Coalition works to promote healthier and safer communities by promoting toba
