(KHI), in partnership with the Mohave County Department of Public Health (MCDPH) leads a broad community initiative to improve health and quality-of-life in Mohave County communities. The initiative engages community stakeholders and the public to make measurable improvements in community health. It involves the following process, which is conducted on a three-year cycle: 1. Researchers collect facts and statistics regarding health and quality-of-life in Mohave County. This process includes speaking to Mohave County residents to obtain their insights. The information is then published in a report called a Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA). 2. Based on the information in the CHNA, KHI and MCDPH work with community members and stakeholders to identify priority health issues. We document the results of these planning efforts in a Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) for each region. 3. KHI plans to address significant needs identified in the 2019 CHNA as follows: - Mental Health - KHI continues to implement strategies to integrate behavioral health services in all KHI primary care clinics and certain specialty clinics (pain clinic, cancer center, etc.). The program educates staff and implements processes for identifying and treating patients who are struggling with depression or who are otherwise at high risk for self-harm. - Substance abuse- KHI continues to implement strategies to address the opioid crises and other substance abuse issues. These strategies include implementing an evidence-based program in the KHI Emergency Department, acute care areas, and outpatient clinics for identifying patients who have addiction risks or current addiction issues. We are now screening most patients for these risk factors.
