FAMILIES. THE HOSPICE PROGRAM ALSO HAS ON-STAFF MEDICAL SOCIAL WORKERS. HOME HEALTH AIDES. A CHAPLAIN AND DIETARY COUNSELING. HOME HEALTH RECORDED A TOTAL OF 21.834 VISITS IN FY2020 AND 1.371 ADMISSIONS. THE HOSPICE AVERAGE DAILY CENSUS IN FY2020 WAS 74.4 DAYS WITH 632 ADMISSIONS.

FOR A TOTAL OF 27,222 DAYS.MHV OWNS AND PROVIDES OVERSIGHT FOR JOINT VENTURES WITH ENTITIES ENTERED INTO BY MEMORIAL HEALTH SYSTEM. ALL OF THESE VENTURES MUST BE IN KEEPING WITH THE HEALTH CARE SYSTEM MISSION OF PROVIDING CONTINUUM OF CARE TO PATIENTS IN CENTRAL ILLINOIS. THEY INCLUDE A LONG TERM CARE FACILITY, AN AMBULATORY SURGICAL TREATMENT CENTER, AND EQUIPMENT LEASING, THE PARTNERSHIP WITH THE EQUIPMENT LEASING COMPANY WAS DISSOLVED ON SEPTEMBER 1, 2020. IN FY2020, MEMORIAL HOSPICE AT HERITAGE, A 19 BED SKILLED NURSING UNIT, CONTINUED TO HELP MEET THE UNIQUE NEEDS OF HOSPICE PATIENTS AND FAMILIES WHO MAY NEED A FACILITY SETTING FOR END-OF-LIFE CARE. 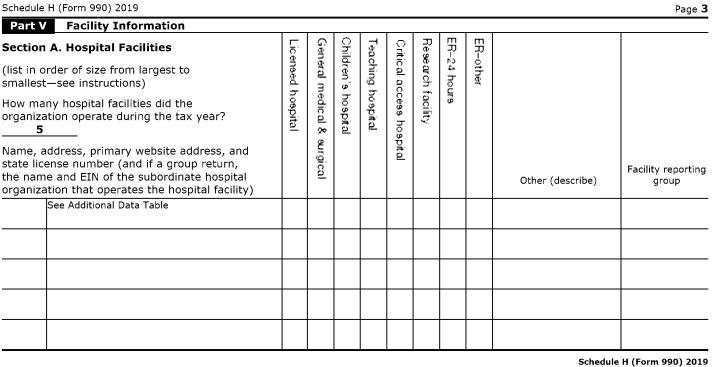
