THIS EIGHT-STORY, 306,000-SQUARE-FOOT HOSPITAL PROVIDES EASIER AND MORE COMFORTABLE ACCESS FOR PATIENTS AND THEIR FAMILIES, PHYSICIANS AND STAFF, IN A FACILITY THAT'S DESIGNED TO PROMOTE HEALING, PREVENTION, EDUCATION, INNOVATION AND WELLNESS. OUR CHEFS AND DIETITIANS REGULARLY HOLD COMMUNITY HEALTHY COOKING DEMONSTRATIONS IN A CONFERENCE SPACE THAT INCLUDES A DEMONSTRATION KITCHEN, AND HAVE HOSTED HUNDREDS OF PARTICIPANTS, INCLUDING PATIENTS AND THEIR FAMILIES.
