WE HAVE AN OPEN MEDICAL STAFF COMPRISED OF QUALIFIED PHYSICIANS WHO WORK WITH US TO PROVIDE CARE TO OUR COMMUNITIES. ALL QUALIFIED PHYSICIANS GRANTED PRIVILEGES TO SERVE WITH US IN OUR HOSPITALS HAVE UNDERGONE A THOROUGH AND COMPREHENSIVE CREDENTIALING PROCESS.

OTHER GOVERNMENT-SPONSORED PROGRAMS IN ADDITION TO THE PROVISION OF CHARITY CARE AND OTHER COMMUNITY SERVICES, CHRISTUS HEALTH PROVIDES SERVICES TO PERSONS COVERED UNDER GOVERNMENT-SPONSORED PROGRAMS, INCLUDING MEDICARE, DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE (DOD) AND TRICARE.
