AT THE CLOSE OF FY21 THIS MONTHLY DIGEST OF BREAKING NEWS AND CURRENT RESEARCH IN THE FIGHT AGAINST CANCER HAD OVER 25,000 SUBSCRIBERS INTERESTED IN THE SCIENCE OF CANCER RISK, AS WELL AS HEALTH PROFESSIONALS LOOKING TO STAY CURRENT.
